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A Note from Pastor Don

Looking back, it was a year of milestones, service and growth!

From a personal standpoint, I had the privilege of serving on the Pine Springs Camp Board and their Strategic Planning Team, several Administrative Commissions for our Washington Presbytery, the Canonsburg-Houston Ministerial Association, and alongside Cathy Stewart, as a Volunteer Weekly at Pine Springs Camp. These opportunities to extend our reach off the CUPC campus were a blessing and along with my annual seminary prayer group retreat and completing my two-year certificate program in Spiritual Direction, I experienced a lot of personal and spiritual growth this past year.

As did our church!

Through the stellar work of our Nominating Committee the year before, we began the year by orienting a host of new Deacons and Elders, even filling several un-expired terms. These leaders were instrumental in some of our major initiatives this year, including the recognition and celebration of 250 Years of Service to Christ and our Community in Canonsburg, that kicked off with a float in annual 4th of July Parade – the first CUPC float in decades!

50 of us went up to Pine Springs Camp in February for the Annual Winter Retreat and we had more snow than ever, allowing us to have an epic afternoon tubing down the hill behind the pool!

We spent the year conducting an updated Confirmation program. After a year of gathering, studying, playing and sharing – we were treated to hearing their Faith Journey projects during a potluck dinner and welcomed 8 confirmands into membership of the church, the most since 2018!

Our children and youth also attended camps for retreats and weeks during the summer, holding several fundraisers and our Kids4Camp team stepped in to lead the Washington County Fair Food Booth, ensuring the long term success of this ministry and extending the blessings throughout the community even further.



We tried something new with our Session & Deacons Board, by gathering in June to share highlights and plans for the year, reflecting on what God has done and what we're feeling called to do in the future. In order to accommodate... the Session even moved from its sacredly ascribed 4th Monday meeting date to gather with the Deacons! It worked so well that we will continue the practice in 2026.

There were lots of times of celebration throughout the year, whether recognizing Pam Walker's 20 years of service as Director of Pastoral Care or the Advent Dinner and games. We celebrated 7 baptisms and 17 Adult New Members joining. We celebrated the lives of 8 members who passed away (and I celebrated another 8 more from our community, along with officiating two weddings). And we celebrated with our Pony League World Series Team, High School graduates and over 200 Vacation Bible School participants!

We also continued to bless the community by hosting the Ministerial Association's monthly Food Pantry, Thanksgiving Dinner, Toy Chest, Santa for Old Fashioned Christmas and several other members and groups in our Fellowship Hall, and now five Recovery Groups that find support and encouragement on our campus each week!

To facilitate the use of our campus, we continued various renovations including the completion of our sanctuary window replacement, the refurbishment of the bridge walkway, updates to the Christian Education building's electrical and fire panels and the installation of a new Carillon. Not to mention the ongoing routine maintenance of cleaning and repairs. And we initiated several needed repairs and replacements to our infrastructure that will take place in 2026 as well.

I don't really need to tell you these things though – because you're feeling the growth that's happening in our church. You're feeling it inside you, which is why you, and so many others, keep showing up more and more to our regular worship services, to our special worship services and to all our special celebratory events and service to this community. We had a dozen Sundays with over 200 in worship. To put a fine point on this – in 2025, we experienced the third straight year of worship attendance growth. It was especially pronounced on Easter and Christmas Eve, when we had 402 and 412 – the highest on Easter since 2019 and on Christmas Eve since 2018!

God's growing us in numbers, but also in Christ, and that's why we keep showing up. To Grow! What a year 2025 was!

At that time, decisions need to be made as to where to directly prioritize our money as well as our resources. I feel that as a team of non-paid volunteers, we do a great job of balancing those priorities as well as our budgeted and non-budgeted needs.

The youth of our church have been good and faithful servants. They have volunteered their time at CUPC by participating in Student Sunday worship services, serving as lay leaders and helping to lead music on Sunday mornings. Three big events that many of our youth are involved with are volunteering their time and talent at VBS where we had over 200 kids in attendance, working at our CUPC food booth at the Washington County Fair and volunteering their time at the Toy Chest. Not only do they serve at CUPC, but they are out in the community serving too! Many students participate in Mission Washington, a local workcamp where they serve the city of Washington in a variety of ways such as painting and mulching playgrounds, building and painting porches, landscaping lawns and other small construction jobs. This past summer we helped a few families clean out their basements after flooding. The students stay for a week in the W & J dorms, have meals catered to them at Church of the Covenant and worship each evening at Life Church. Several adult CUPC members have volunteered their time to serve meals and snacks and supervise job sites. We are always looking for adult volunteers to help out. Mission Washington 2026 will be June 21-26.

The Family Ministry team has also been reaching out to the UP With Kids families and community to invite them to some fun events. We had a Family Fun Night at the Wild Things Game with a buffet dinner in the EQT pavilion. We had 118 people and a fun time was had by all. A great time was had by all. We also had another successful Trunk or Treat event with our church, UP With Kids families and even community members. We had about a dozen decorated trunks and many trick or treaters. We are looking forward to growing this event next year. We also had two Parent's Night Out events this past year for both church families and UP With Kids families, one in the spring and one in the fall. We had dinner with the kids, played games and had fun with friends while parents were able to go to dinner, shopping or catch a 3 hour nap if they wanted. We are always looking for new opportunities to connect.

We are welcoming back Miss Pat for part-time Infant Room help. We were able to increase staff wages again this year and we continue to try to reduce overtime. We are also planning an increase in tuition cost in the Fall of 2026.

We continue to offer before and after Kindergarten care for children in the Canon-McMillan School District. We are so glad to be able to continue to offer this to our families. The number of school-aged children has grown, which we are thankful for. We hosted our second Thanksgiving Dinner for daycare kids and their families, which was again a huge hit!

Our hopes for 2026 are to hire more staff and continue to grow our before and after Kindergarten classroom program. We are currently registering Summer Care for school aged children.

Deacons

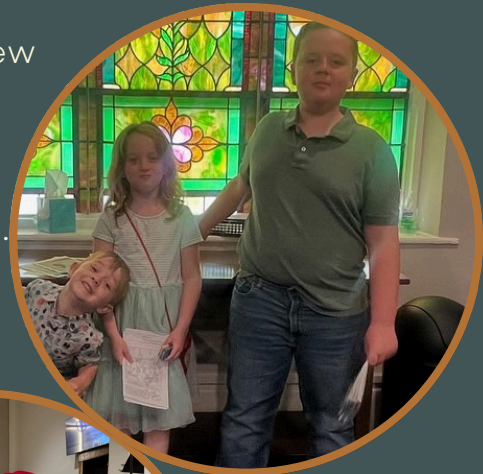

There are currently 34 special friends to whom the Deacons minister. These special friends receive visits, calls and cards throughout the year as well as gift bags and plants at Easter and Christmas. The Deacons sent 23 Valentine boxes to our students in college.

The Deacons hosted the Fall Luncheon in October for special friends and all church members ages 75 & up. There were 28 guests and 12 Deacons. Meals were also delivered to special friends who could not attend. 237 shoeboxes were collected for Operation Christmas Child. 85 permanent residents of Townview Nursing Home received Angel Tree gift bags for Christmas.

The deacons hosted the 19th Annual Christmas Laser Shows. George Doworth and his Lightwave International team put on 4 amazing shows over two evenings. Approximately 800 people attended and a record amount of \$11,153.84 was raised. A huge thank you to George and his crew for generously donating their time and talents.

These funds allow the deacons to provide financial respite to local individuals and give to local charitable organizations. Thank you to all of the Deacons, Lay Shepherds and church members who continue to minister and care for our church family and community.





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
