NO HAND-ME-DOWNS WITH JESUS!

...assuming that you have heard about him and were taught in him, as the truth is in Jesus, to put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness. Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another.

Ephesians 4:21-25

I have A LOT of sympathy/empathy for my son Collin, who is the younger brother. Although my brother complained that my parents were easier on me than they were on him, it's tough to be the younger sibling. (Actually, there may be something to that as Christopher, the older brother, has made the same appeal to his mother and I.)

The younger brother gets picked on (I think that's universal). The older brother gets to stay up later and watch PG-13 movies. The younger

brother (in our house), must still live on G and PG movies. The younger brother watched his older brother shoot up his 8th grade and freshman year and proceed to tower over him.

So far, most of these things are temporary. Collin issues are resolved once he reaches the same age his brother was when he received more freedom and responsibilities.

However, there is one thing an older sibling cannot understand. Have you ever experienced having to wear "hand-me-downs"? This is a condition that normally only ails the younger sibling. I had to bear this burden as the younger brother.

Most of the time, Collin is fine with hand-me-downs. Sometimes, it's annoying. This will likely continue until the younger brother catches the older brother in size. Right now, we have a long way to go. We do make a point to give Collin some new clothes for Christmas.

What does this have to do with

Jesus? Well, here is the Good News, When we receive Jesus and are adopted by our heavenly Father, we take off the old self and put on a new self. There are no hand-me-downs with God. He renews everything when we repent and open ourselves to everything God has to offer.

Paul reminds us that we the worn-out garment of self are replaced with new. Sin corrupts our old self and then separates us from God. The old self says we have to clean ourselves up but we also have to carry all the hurt and pain that we have put on ourselves or others have passed to us. The new self reminds us that we were created in the image of God. We were made to be righteous and holy!

Paul says, in our new selves, we need to "speak the truth with our neighbor." Renewal is pretty simple: Love God and God will give you a new self to love God more and love your neighbor as God loves us. Put on your new self in Jesus!
