David again gathered all the chosen men of Israel, thirty thousand. And David arose and went with all the people who were with him from Baale-judah to bring up from there the ark of God, which is called by the name of the Lord of hosts who sits enthroned on the cherubim. And they carried the ark of God on a new cart and brought it out of the house of Abinadab, which was on the hill. And Uzzah and Ahio. the sons of Abinadab, were driving the new cart, with the ark of God, and Ahio went before the ark. And David and all the house of Israel were celebrating before the Lord, with songs and lyres and harps and tambourines and castanets and cymbals. 2 Samuel 6:1-5

Greetings in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. I pray your summer has been filled with blessings and even some rest. We have spent a month this summer talking about David and his anointing by Samuel to be king of all Israel.

David experienced a long and arduous journey to become king. His family didn't seem to accept this anointing. Goliath laughed at his anointing. Saul fought his anointing and tried to kill him. David fought for his life daily before he become the king.

The phrase "It's good to be the king!" might be a huge exaggeration regarding decades of David's tenure. It seems that Israel was constantly battling to secure the promised land. Enemies from every direction sought to stop the house of David and the chosen people of God.

The day finally came that they secured Jerusalem, which became known as the city of David. One of the biggest celebrations was moving the ark of the covenant into the city. Here were lyres, harps, tambourines, castanets ("clackers"), and cymbals. Songs of celebration rang out while

they rolled the ark in on a cart.

It is now time for us to celebrate with a joyful noise! In a few days, we plan to be worshiping in our new location. We have transformed an open office space into a house of worship!

We are applying the finishing touches as you read this. In this space, we will have our own entry way, worship space, café, kitchen, office, and classroom.

We will soon no longer just call this our new space. Now we call it our church. Although many newer churches worship in retail or office spaces, I have NEVER done this! For many of us, this is a new adventure. However, it is okay to now call this space: church.

SERMON SERIES - ANOINTED

According to Strong's Concordance, the Hebrew חַשָּׁשָׁ (māšah) means to anoint, to smear, or to consecrate. God called Samuel to anoint David as king over all Israel. David, under inspiration of the Holy Spirit, called Zadok the priest and Nathan the prophet to anoint his son Solomon as king. When someone is anointed, they are set apart for a special service. God can do amazing things with a person anointed for holy purposes! In Jesus (the ultimate māšah) we are anointed and set apart for holy purposes! Discover what we can learn from David and Solomon about being God's anointed people.

August 3 - 1 Kings 1:32-37, Anointed: David's Legacy (2 Samuel 23:1-7)


David, with his anointing and gifts, accomplished amazing things for God's glory. God offered David a legacy he many not have chosen for himself. Will you trust your legacy to God?
