TODAY DEMANDS BOLDNESS!

This week, I shared the following on Facebook:

"I have received a couple of concerned texts about the assassination of Charlie Kirk. I will admit that it hit pretty hard for me. Political differences are one thing, but this regularity of assassination attempts, mobs, and viral hatred is sliding out of control. If regular fits of anger and hatred are poured out, violence can result.

We have certain inalienable rights in the United States. Free speech is one of them. However, there must be some accountability for the prodding and condoning of violence and killing.

As followers of Jesus, this accountability begins with looking in the mirror. How do we love in the midst of so much hatred? How do we show that Jesus is alive and has still won the victory? Reality: a 31-year-old husband and father was killed, seemingly for talking about his political and faith convictions to young adults who may not otherwise hear another

side of things. How should we respond? We need to follow Jesus. Don't react with vengeance. Be proactive with faith in Jesus. If you are mad or disturbed by this crime or what someone else says...please stop and pray, be open to sharing about Jesus, and let Him shine through you."

I have heard calls for civil war! We are to be bold as Christians! We do need to fight...but we need to fight evil with good. We fight hate with love. We fight the enemy of the cross with the love and power of the cross. Erika Frantzve recently introduced her now-deceased husband with these words: "My husband, Charlie Kirk, is a force. He is a force. He is bold when the world demands silence. He is fearless where others flinch, and he has taken on the battle of the next generation, changing these hearts and minds."

Wherever you fall politically, I think we can all learn something from the boldness of Charlie Kirk. His battle for hearts and minds came through words and from what I could see, with love.

He treated people who disagreed with him as human beings, but didn't waver in his convictions. I heard one young lady ask him who she should side with: her mom (conservative) or her dad (liberal). Kirk told her to obey and respect her parents. It wasn't about choosing a side! He told her to honor and love both of them as God commands.

When faced with threats and hostility, the apostles didn't pray for the instigators to be silenced, but prayed for boldness (Acts 4:29). May we pray for a boldness to follow Jesus, even when we are angry or hurt. Remember: "...[W]e do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places (Ephesians 6:12)."

Charlie Kirk and the world don't need our vengeance. Neither is silence the right answer. Today demands boldness. Let's tell the world about Jesus. God give us boldness in love!


