Listening Guide Remembering His Name

Luke 2:1-13

Savior

The title reminds us that we <u>need</u> God to do something for us we cannot do for ourselves.

Unfortunately, most people don't see a <u>need</u> for a Savior, because they don't believe God will punish them for sin.

Luke 16:19-28

Christ or in some translations it reads Messiah

He is the One you've all been waiting for all your life.

This <u>connects</u> the birth of Christ to every promise ever made about Him by the prophets in the Old Testament.

Isaiah 7:14; 9:6, Micah 5:2, 4-5, and Malachi 3:1

These and hundreds more are uniquely fulfilled in life of Jesus Christ. Each one becomes another reason to believe.

This title confronts us with the most important <u>decision</u> any one will ever have to make. A decision about "who or what" will be in control of our lives.

For some it will be profit.

For others it will be people.

And for more than we can count it will be pleasure.
