"That you may believe: Seeing and Knowing" John 9:1-12

1. In what ways do you find yourself wrestling with the WHY and WHO of suffering or circumstances?
2. How does it land with you when Jesus' suggests that the display of God's work could be a central purpose of your circumstances?
3. How are you wrestling with the relationship of faith and action?
 What do you make of the fact that Jesus invites the man into actions before he is healed? Read the rest of the chapter – How does the man's understanding of Jesus change or grow? In what ways can doing precede knowing (or feeling)?
4. How do you struggle with the relationship between what we KNOW and DON'T KNOW?
5. Are there ways that we can be resistant to healing and transformation because of how closely we are identified with BIG pieces of suffering in our lives or areas of "darkness"?
