Thoughts to Shape and Spark Discussion:

Themes and Questions to Guide Reflection and Response:

What from the Scripture passage or the sermon made an impression upon you? Are there lingering questions to be answered? What is God showing you about Himself and yourself in this passage?

What "preview of coming attractions" is Jesus giving through this miracle? How does that preview of His Kingdom meet you in your disappointment, your striving to manage a broken world, or your fear that things are going very badly out of control?

Why are blindness and guilt and the effects of sin not an obstacle for Jesus and His gospel? Why is presumed sight such a hindrance?

What do you make of Capon's assertion about God's grace and "keeping score"? Why would keeping score prevent the prevail of grace in the Pharisees' lives and our lives?

Describe the progression of the healed man's emerging faith in Jesus. Has your faith or journey to faith followed a similar path? How so, or how not so?

How does this sign point us toward and connect with the ultimate sign of Jesus' work on the cross?
