


Hope Church Women's Bible Study: Revelation 15

February 24-25, 2026



**Dwell:** As you listen to the passage being read, what have you heard before? What's new? Jot down things you're curious about.



**Dig:** 1. Look at the "bookends" of Rev. 15 – the first and last verses. What theme/words do these verses have in common? How might this suggest John's focus here?

2. Circle the words "saw" or "looked" in this passage, and list the 3 things John saw.

3. John doesn't directly specify the location of verses 2- 8. What words/images give you an idea?

4. Let's explore the "Song of Moses and the Lamb" (vs 3b-4):

- a. Read parts of the original "Song of Moses" on the back (Ex. 15). Identify words or ideas you also see in Revelation 15.
- b. What was going on when Moses and the people first sang this song? What had just happened, and where were they going? How might all this deepen our understanding of the heavenly scene and song of Rev. 15?
- c. What might the song's new title be telling us?

5. In v. 5 we see the "sanctuary of the tent of witness," reminding us of the tabernacle of the wilderness days (see Ex. 40:1-3). Why might that be a particularly apt image for John to use here? What might be the meaning of the smoke? Use the rest of the verses on the back to consider the Biblical images John wants us to recall.

6. Speaking of *finishing* (v. 1 and 8), Jesus famously said "*It is finished*" on the cross (John 19:30). What had he finished? Discuss what might be the relationship between that "finish" and the one here in Revelation.

7. What do you learn about God (Father, Son, Holy Spirit) from this passage?



**Deepen:** 1. Think about the conquerors' song – the Song of Moses and the Lamb. What does this stir up in you? How is your worship similar or different from their worship?

2. How are these judgment passages hitting you today? How are you encouraged? How challenged?
  
3. How does this passage speak to you in the middle of your own wilderness journey today?

**Exodus 14:29-30, 15:1-18 (selections)**

<sup>29</sup> But the people of Israel walked on dry ground through the sea, the waters being a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. <sup>30</sup> Thus the Lord saved Israel that day from the hand of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore. <sup>31</sup> Israel saw the great power that the Lord used against the Egyptians, so the people feared the Lord, and they believed in the Lord and in his servant Moses.

**15** Then Moses and the people of Israel sang this song to the Lord, saying, "I will sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously; the horse and his rider he has thrown into the sea. <sup>2</sup> The Lord is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation; this is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him. ...<sup>6</sup> Your right hand, O Lord, glorious in power, your right hand, O Lord, shatters the enemy.<sup>7</sup> In the greatness of your majesty you overthrow your adversaries; you send out your fury; it consumes them like stubble. ...<sup>11</sup> "Who is like you, O Lord, among the gods? Who is like you, majestic in holiness, awesome in glorious deeds, doing wonders? <sup>12</sup> You stretched out your right hand; the earth swallowed them. <sup>13</sup> "You have led in your steadfast love the people whom you have redeemed; you have guided them by your strength to your holy abode. ...<sup>16</sup> Terror and dread fall upon [the peoples]; because of the greatness of your arm, they are still as a stone, till your people, O Lord, pass by, till the people pass by whom you have purchased. <sup>17</sup> You will bring them in and plant them on your own mountain, the place, O Lord, which you have made for your abode, the sanctuary, O Lord, which your hands have established. <sup>18</sup> The Lord will reign forever and ever."

**Ex. 40:1-3, 33-35** The Lord spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup> "On the first day of the first month you shall erect the tabernacle of the tent of meeting. <sup>3</sup> And you shall put in it the ark of the testimony, and you shall screen the ark with the veil. .... <sup>33</sup> And he erected the court around the tabernacle and the altar, and set up the screen of the gate of the court. So Moses finished the work. <sup>34</sup> Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle. <sup>35</sup> And Moses was not able to enter the tent of meeting because the cloud settled on it, and the glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle...<sup>38</sup> For the cloud of the Lord was on the tabernacle by day, and fire was in it by night, in the sight of all the house of Israel throughout all their journeys.

**2 Chron. 7:1-2** As soon as Solomon finished his prayer, fire came down from heaven and consumed the burnt offering and the sacrifices, and the glory of the Lord filled the temple. <sup>2</sup> And the priests could not enter the house of the Lord, because the glory of the Lord filled the Lord's house.

**Isaiah 6:1-4** In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. <sup>2</sup> Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. <sup>3</sup> And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts;  
the whole earth is full of his glory!"

<sup>4</sup> And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke.
