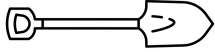


## Hope Church Women's Bible Study: Revelation 19:11-20:15

**Dig:** 1. In Revelation 19:11-16, we find a powerful description of Jesus. List each characteristic, name, and action as John describes them in these verses.

3. In Revelation 20:1-6 we learn of a thousand year period of time, often called "the Millennium."

- What does John tell us God's purpose is in "chaining up" Satan during this time (20:3)?
- Describe what John sees God's people doing during this time (20:4-6).

4. What is God's basis for the judgment of all people (20:12, 14-15)? What do you think "the second death" might refer to, and why is it that God's people need not fear it (20:6, 15)?

5. What do you learn about God (Father, Son, Holy Spirit) from this passage?



**Deepen:**

1. Review the first Dig question where you wrote down how John describes Jesus (19:11-16). Are any of those hard for you to believe? What lies might Satan be trying to get *you* to believe about Jesus? *Choose a specific attribute of Jesus that John reveals here, and ask your group to pray for you that your faith might be strengthened regarding that specific truth about Jesus.*

2. Consider very specific challenges or suffering you (or somebody you love) are experiencing right now. How might the promises of Revelation 19-20 help you in the midst of your struggles? *Be honest*, and invite others in to pray with you for God's help.

**Isaiah 11** There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit.

<sup>2</sup> And the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him,  
the Spirit of wisdom and understanding,  
the Spirit of counsel and might,  
the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.

<sup>3</sup> And his delight shall be in the fear of the Lord.  
He shall not judge by what his eyes see,  
or decide disputes by what his ears hear,

<sup>4</sup> but with righteousness he shall judge the poor,  
and decide with equity for the meek of the earth;  
and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his  
mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the  
wicked.

<sup>5</sup> Righteousness shall be the belt of his waist,  
and faithfulness the belt of his loins.

**Psalm 2:** Why do the nations rage  
and the peoples plot in vain?

<sup>2</sup> The kings of the earth set themselves,  
and the rulers take counsel together,  
against the Lord and against his Anointed, saying,

<sup>3</sup> "Let us burst their bonds apart  
and cast away their cords from us."

<sup>4</sup> He who sits in the heavens laughs;  
the Lord holds them in derision.

<sup>5</sup> Then he will speak to them in his wrath,  
and terrify them in his fury, saying,

<sup>6</sup> "As for me, I have set my King  
on Zion, my holy hill."

<sup>7</sup> I will tell of the decree:

The Lord said to me, "You are my Son;  
today I have begotten you.

<sup>8</sup> Ask of me, and I will make the nations your heritage,  
and the ends of the earth your possession.

<sup>9</sup> You shall break them with a rod of iron  
and dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel."

**Isaiah 63** Who is this who comes from Edom,  
in crimsoned garments from Bozrah,  
he who is splendid in his apparel,  
marching in the greatness of his strength?

"It is I, speaking in righteousness, mighty to save."

<sup>2</sup> Why is your apparel red, and your garments like  
his who treads in the winepress?

<sup>3</sup> "I have trodden the winepress alone,  
and from the peoples no one was with me;

I trod them in my anger  
and trampled them in my wrath;  
their lifeblood spattered on my garments,  
and stained all my apparel.

<sup>4</sup> For the day of vengeance was in my heart,  
and my year of redemption had come.

<sup>5</sup> I looked, but there was no one to help;  
I was appalled, but there was no one to uphold;  
so my own arm brought me salvation,  
and my wrath upheld me.
