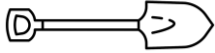


Revelation 22:6-21 Discussion Guide “Come Lord Jesus!”

DWELL As you listen to the passage, consider how it concludes the book of Revelation. How does it connect the themes and ideas we have seen in Revelation?



DIG 1. What is Jesus’ message repeated three times in this passage (v7, 12, 20).

- What is the significance of the message and why might it be repeated here?

2. How does Jesus identify Himself in this passage (v13; v16)?

How is this familiar to you in light of the rest of the book (1:8, 17; 2:8; 5:5; 2:28)

3. Two of the seven benedictions in Revelation are found in this passage. Use the chart to consider these seven references to being blessed. What significance does each hold for believers?

4. What is the invitation in v17? Read Isaiah 55:1-7 for further insight.

- What is the warning in v18-19? How does one both accept the invitation and heed the warning?

5. What do you learn about God (Father, Son, Holy Spirit) from this passage and from all of Revelation?



DEEPEN

1. How might you live out the response “Amen. Come Lord Jesus!” in your life now?

2. As we consider this entire study of Revelation: What present darkness are you most eager to see pass away, whether personal or more general? How do the words of Revelation strengthen you to be a light in the darkness until Christ’s return? (From Jen Wilkin’s Revelation study)

3. As you consider what you have learned and want to hold on to from our study of Revelation, in what specific ways can your group be praying for you this summer?
