Literature: Narrative/Law Code

Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus Numbers, Deuteronomy Where It Fits: Origin of the nation of Israel/Detailed laws and instructions for them.

How to Read: Approach with curiosity. Some of this is irrelevant but gives you a glimpse into God's heart and character.

GOSPELS/ACTS

Literature: Narrative

Where It Fits: Biographies of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. The ministry and church planting work of the 12 Apostles.

How to Read: Read the gospels slowly. Jesus will challenge you. John is vastly different from the other gospels. Don't let this scare you but be prepared. The book of acts gives us a glimpse into the first churches ever planted. We should take notes.

HISTORICAL BOOKS

Literature: Narrative

Joshua, Judges, Ruth 1 & 2 Samuel 1 &2 Kings 1 & 2 Chronicles Where It Fits: Entire history of Israel as a nation up to their return from exile.

How to Read: Birds eye view of how sin can spiral into destruction. Be introspective about your own shortcomings.

WISDOM/POETRY

Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther

Literature: Poetry/Song

Job, Psalms Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs Where It Fits: It doesn't. Collected wisdom of Israel throughout their history.

How to Read: For people wanting to explore questions regarding God's justice, the meaning of life, and wisdom.

Where It Fits: Letters from the apostles to the 1st century churches. Some are encouraging, some are theological, some are harsh rebukes.

How to Read: These books will provide the most direct application for your life today. These letters are designed to be read in one sitting. Be aware of the structure of the book when reading individual sections.

PROPHETS

Literature: Narrative/Poetry

Major: Isaiah, Jeremiah Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel

Minor: Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habukkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi Where It Fits: Different places within the events of the historical books (Pre Exile, Mid Exile, Post Exile).
Collected teachings of prophets who existed during these times. Fills in the silhouette of what the messiah will look like.

How to Read: The job of the prophet is to point Israel back to the law and to remind them of the consequences of their disobedience. Not just about predicting the future.

REVELATION

Literature: Apocalyptic

Revelation

Where It Fits: The end of the story. How God is fulfilling His promises in the Old Testament to set up an eternal kingdom of peace and righteousness, restoring humanity to its identity and purpose in the world.

How to Read: This book is complex and loaded with imagery and metaphor. Don't divide with people over interpretation. The main point is that Jesus is coming back to restore the earth and bring His presence in full to the earth.
