

#### Is God calling you to leadership here at St. Mark's?


Lay Servant Ministries is one of the most significant lay leadership development programs available within the United Methodist connection. Through this equipping and empowering system, lay

## Pastor T's

In the grace and peace of Christ,

Pastor Tuulauena Lolohea

This past Sunday was a day I will never forget. It marked my very first baptism as a pastor. Growing up in the United Methodist Church as a pastor's kid, I always looked forward to baptisms. But to stand there, to feel the holy water, to read the sacred liturgy, and to lead this moment of spiritual significance—it moved me deeply. It was more than a ceremony; it was a holy moment filled with the presence of God.



Baptism is one of the sacred and holy sacraments we practice in the Methodist Church. It is a beautiful and powerful way we witness God's grace firsthand. That is why, in the Methodist tradition, we baptize infants—because even though the child may not yet understand what is happening, God's love and grace are present. We call this **prevenient grace**—God's grace that goes before us, drawing us closer to Him from the very beginning.

First, I want to give all glory and honor to God. Second, I want to thank the Skaggs family—especially baby Bennett—for allowing me the privilege of being part of this sacred milestone. And finally, I want to thank our entire church community at St. Mark's UMC, particularly our Sanctuary campus.

We made sure this baptism was a shared celebration. The children sat in the front, the Skaggs family close behind, and the entire congregation stood as one—honoring the initiation of this precious child into the body of Christ, the Church.

Past

Our church's mission is simple and powerful: We gather. We connect. We serve. So that all may experience the love of Christ. And this Sunday, we truly lived that mission out.


## words from our Pastor
