our district superintendent to review the business and mission of the local church. We will celebrate the work of the year with our committees, hear from our task forces


set our pastors' salaries, and more. An agenda, relevant materials, and the zoom link will be sent via email the week before. Everyone is welcome to attend; church members can vote.

When someone is struggling with grief, we want to provide support but often do not know how to help. 
Wednesday Morning Study October 15 – November 19





Did You Know... Tucson Pride

Tucson Lesbian and Gay Alliance, known as Tucson Pride, was founded in 1977, after the murder of Richard Heakin. Heakin was visiting a friend in Tucson, and on June 6, 1976, was brutally beaten to death outside a gay bar in Tucson by a group of high school boys.

The teens were sentenced to probation. Tucsonans were outraged that the killers received only probation for this hate crime and pressed for change. Tucson introduced some of the first LGBTQ+ antidiscrimination legislation in the country and formed new organizations and pride events celebrating the LGBTQ+ community. "It was through his death that great social change came to Tucson and Pima County," said Dan Behling, a pastor at St. Phillip's in the Hills Episcopal Church. Tucson Pride hosts the annual Pride in the Desert festivities in the fall when temperatures are cooler. This year will be even cooler with the new fall dates of November 21-23, 2025.

International Friends

Tucson, Arizona

August brought the start of a new school year at the University of Arizona, along with thousands of new students —including many from around the world. These international students arrive eager to learn, meet Americans, and experience our culture, but the transition can also be daunting as they leave family and friends behind.

On September 7 and 21, Randy Spalding and Pat Gilman, cochairs of the nonprofit International Friends Tucson, visited St. Mark's UMC campuses to share how their group connects local volunteers with international students. This is not a live-in host program, but rather a friendship-building opportunity. Sponsors and students arrange monthly activities together—from sharing a meal to visiting the Desert Museum. Many lasting friendships (and even international visits!) have grown from these connections.

Several St. Mark's members have already stepped forward to sponsor students, living out our call to serve our community and neighbors. But more sponsors are still needed!

From the Finance Committee

Soon we will all receive a brochure inviting all of us to prayerfully consider our pledges as part of the 2026 Stewardship Campaign. This brochure contains a snapshot of the many activities and missions that St. Mark's supports, in addition to some statistics from past stewardship campaigns.

We also wanted to give the congregation an update on income versus expenses for 2025 and a comparison versus 2024. St. Mark's has had a deficit budget for the last two (2) years and while the 2025 YTD (through August) numbers are encouraging, it is important to point out that the 2025 budget includes reducing our local Missions allocation to 7% from our goal of 10% and lowering our apportionments paid to the Desert Southwest Conference. These decisions were recommended by the Finance Committee and approved by Covenant Council.

All of this is in addition to maintaining an aging campus in a safe manner and supporting the work of our clergy and lay staff.

What do you do when you approach an anniversary? My wedding anniversary is just a few weeks before my husband's birthday. It's rare that I come up with something memorable for both occasions in the same year! But this next year, we'll mark our silver anniversary. Surely, we'll do something special for that? Anniversaries give us a chance to pause, reflect, and celebrate what has taken root and grown strong over time. This year, St. Mark's is celebrating alongside two important partners:

- Interfaith Community Services (ICS) turns 40. St. Mark's was one of the six original churches that helped launch ICS in 1985. For four decades, ICS has been rooted in compassion and service, walking alongside neighbors in Pima County facing hunger, homelessness, poverty, isolation, and disabilities. We will join in their anniversary celebration this November.
