ORDINARY TIME

The long season of Ordinary Time, or "the Season after Pentecost", highlights the work of the Holy Spirit in the mission of the church. Given this focus on the now and coming kingdom, some have called this season "kingdomtide."

Ordinary Time begins with Trinity Sunday and contains another principal feast, All Saints (Nov 1), the ancient remembrance of those who gave their lives for the faith. Also known as "the season of the church," it wraps up with the modern addition to the liturgical calendar, Christ the King Sunday, a reminder that we have a King and it is not us.



- ¹⁴ Jesus replied, "Man, who appointed me a judge or an arbiter between you?" ¹⁵ Then he said to them, "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions."
- ¹⁶ And he told them this parable: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded an abundant harvest. ¹⁷ He thought to himself, 'What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops.'

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.



People: We lift them up to the Lord.






