ORDINARY TIME

The long season of Ordinary Time, or “the Season after Pentecost”, highlights the work of the Holy Spirit in the mission of the church. Given this focus on the now and coming kingdom, some have called this season “kingdomtide.”

Ordinary Time begins with Trinity Sunday and contains another principal feast, All Saints (Nov 1), the ancient remembrance of those who gave their lives for the Faith. Also known as “the season of the church,” it wraps up with the modern addition to the liturgical calendar, Christ the King Sunday, a reminder that we have a King and it is not us.

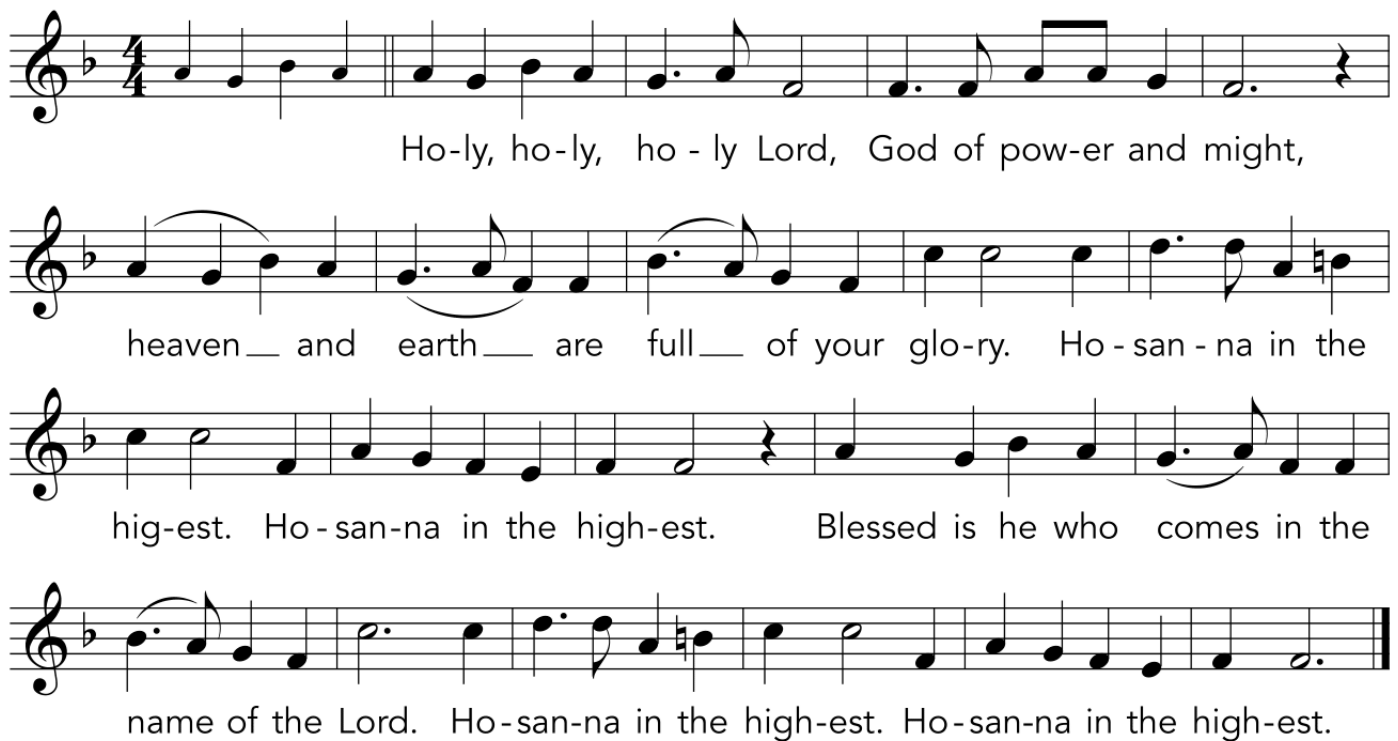

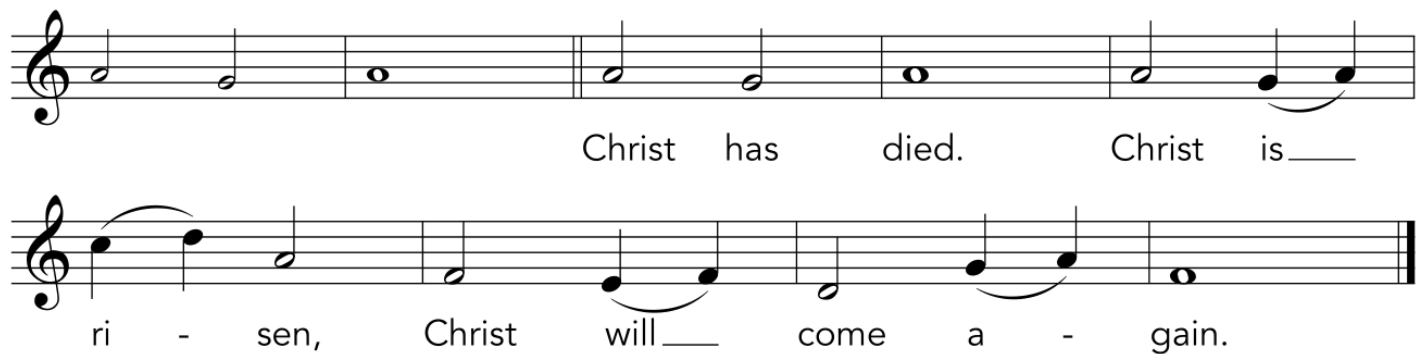

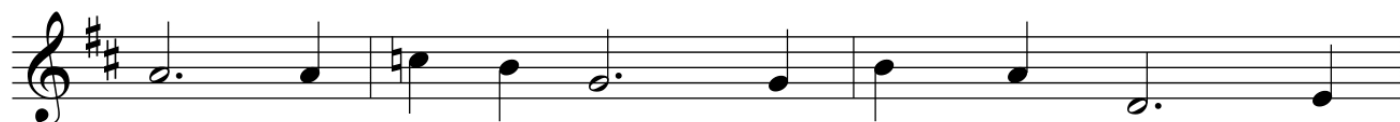
