



At Bethany, we believe every child deserves a place where they are welcomed, loved, and shown the love of Christ—just as they are. That's the heart behind our Bridges Special Needs Ministry, a vital part of our church life and outreach.

Why Bridges Matters

Did you know that 1 in 6 children today has some form of disability or special need? And that the divorce rate for parents of special needs children is as high as 90%? The need for support, encouragement, and community for these families is urgent and real.

Bridges began more than 15 years ago, and we are blessed to continue this important ministry today. It exists to create a path to God for every child with unique needs—and to provide their parents with the opportunity to worship, learn, and grow in fellowship, knowing their children are safe, loved, and spiritually nurtured.

Church can be overwhelming for children with sensory or cognitive differences. Our goal is to change that. If a child feels comfortable, welcomed, and eager to walk through our doors, we know we've fulfilled the calling God has placed on this ministry.

What Bridges Offers

- Sunday Worship Care
 During both the 8:30 and 11 am services, the Bridges Room provides a calm, welcoming space with activities designed specifically for children with special needs.
- Sunday School Support
 At 9:45 am, while parents attend their adult classes,
 children in Bridges receive Bible lessons and activities
 geared to their individual learning styles and
 developmental levels.
- Respite Nights
 Every 4th Friday from 6–9 pm, we host Respite Night—a fun evening of crafts, snacks, and play for children with special needs and their siblings (up to age 12). It's a blessing for the kids and a much-needed break for parents.

How You Can Help

You don't need special training to serve with Bridges—just a patient heart, loving spirit, and willing hands. Help is needed in all areas, especially on the Respite nights.

Whether you're a teen or an adult, who is interested in serving, we invite you to consider stepping in. Your presence could make all the difference for a child who just needs to know they're seen, valued, and loved by God.

Supporting Lowcountry Orphan Relief



Spotlight on Children's Ministries

This October, Bethany is excited to shine a spotlight on Children's Ministries, one of the most vibrant and vital areas of our church life. Children are our most precious members, and it is our sacred duty to guide them in their faith journey.

The mission of Children's Ministries is clear and heartfelt: Children's Ministry exists to create a safe environment in which to bring children into age-appropriate worship where they can belong to the family of God, grow in their relationship with Christ, be inspired to serve, and then go share Christ in the world.

A Commitment to Safety

We know how important it is to keep our children safe. Bethany's Safe Sanctuary Policy sets procedures to protect children of all ages. All staff and volunteers complete specialized training, including a national background check, so that parents can feel confident their children are loved and secure while they are here.

Weekly Opportunities for Children

Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings are full of opportunities for children to learn, grow, and participate in church life. From Children's Church during worship and Sunday School classes, to choir rehearsals and midweek activities, there is always something designed to help kids belong, serve, and deepen their faith.

Nursery Ministry

Our Nursery Ministry is top-notch, caring for children ages five and under on Sunday mornings, Wednesday evenings, and during church-wide events. Bethany's nursery staff are paid employees, trained in CPR and First Aid, and committed to providing consistent, loving care. Our nursery policies and guidelines help ensure each child's safety and well-being. Parents can worship, serve, and participate knowing their little ones are safe, happy, and loved.

Bridges Special Needs Ministry

Bethany is also blessed with a ministry dedicated to embracing and serving children with special needs and their families. Bridges Special Needs Ministry exists to make the love and acceptance of Jesus Christ, the encouragement of fellowship, and the joy of worship fully accessible to every child.

Bridges provides a specially equipped classroom tailored for children with unique needs. Our director works closely with families to provide the best care and plan for each child—whether that means time in worship, a Sunday School buddy, or a quiet space for rest.

In addition, Bridges offers a monthly Respite Night giving parents and caregivers a much-needed evening out while their children enjoy a night of fun and care.

Child Development Center and KidsCare

Bethany is home to both a preschool and an elementary after-school program, serving families throughout our community.

The Child Development Center (CDC) offers half-day preschool for children ages 2 through Kindergarten. With over 150 students, it is one of the top preschools in the area, committed to nurturing young children in a safe, positive, and Christ-centered environment.

KidsCare provides after-school and summer camp care for Kindergarten through 5th grade students, picking up from 8 local schools. With chapel, field trips, mission projects, and plenty of fun, KidsCare teaches children how to live like Jesus in their everyday lives.


Special Events Throughout the Year
