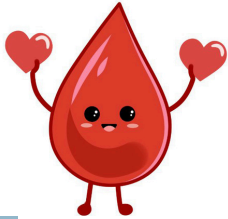
Children and Youth will have their regular activities. The Cherub, Melody and Wesley choirs will be working on the spring musical.

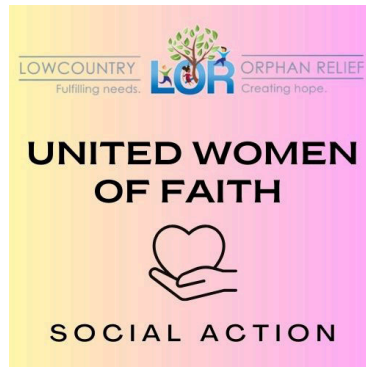

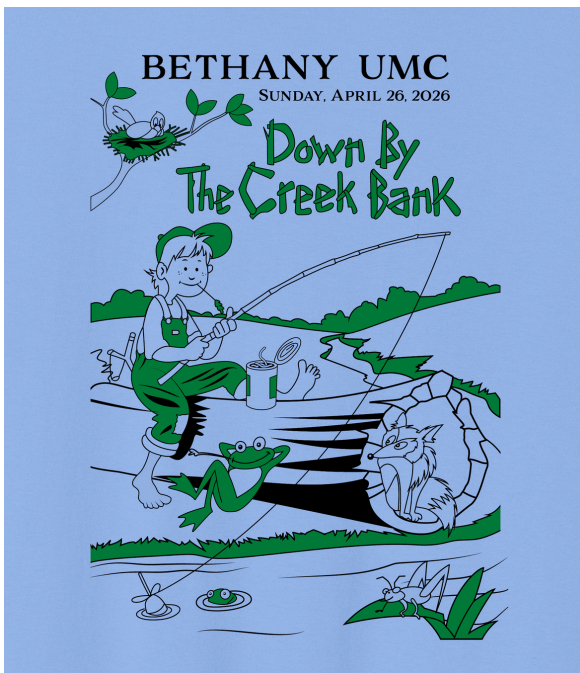


## Butterfly Release – Celebrating New Life in Christ

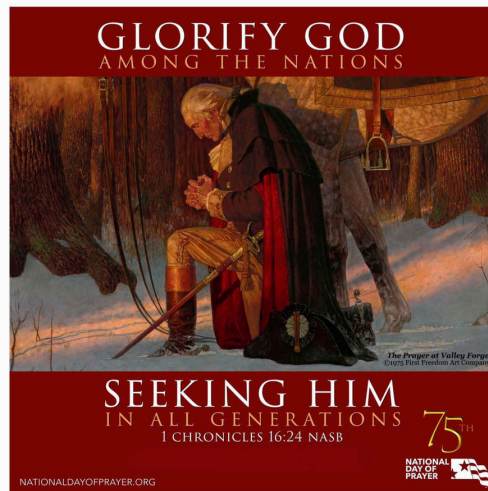

# Happy Hearts Luncheon
