From the Pastor

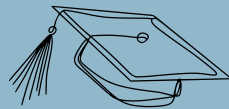
There never seems to be enough hours in a day. How are we to accomplish all the tasks that are before us? You're serving at church, volunteering with local charities, doing daily chores, running to doctor visits, and even taking care of loved ones—yet there never seems to be enough time. Every second of the day is accounted for, yet so much is left undone. Your days are long, and your body is exhausted. At the end of the day, you wonder: when will it be enough? When does the Sabbath come?

Too often, we see all the needs at once. We see the hill we have to climb and wonder if it is worth it. We want to love others, but in our striving, we leave ourselves burned out and too busy to hear from God. And in the end, we never reach the apex—at least not on our own. In Matthew 22, Jesus reminds the religious elite, and all those listening, to make the main thing the main thing. If we focus on loving God and loving our neighbors, it will result in us fulfilling God's commands.

We don't have to end world hunger in an afternoon or heal every broken heart in a day. Instead, Jesus says the most important thing we can do is love Him and love others. That's our charge. So rather than getting overwhelmed by all that we can't do, we start with what we can do. Loving our neighbors can be as simple as cooking an extra lasagna to bring to the widow next door or playing ball with the kid down the street.

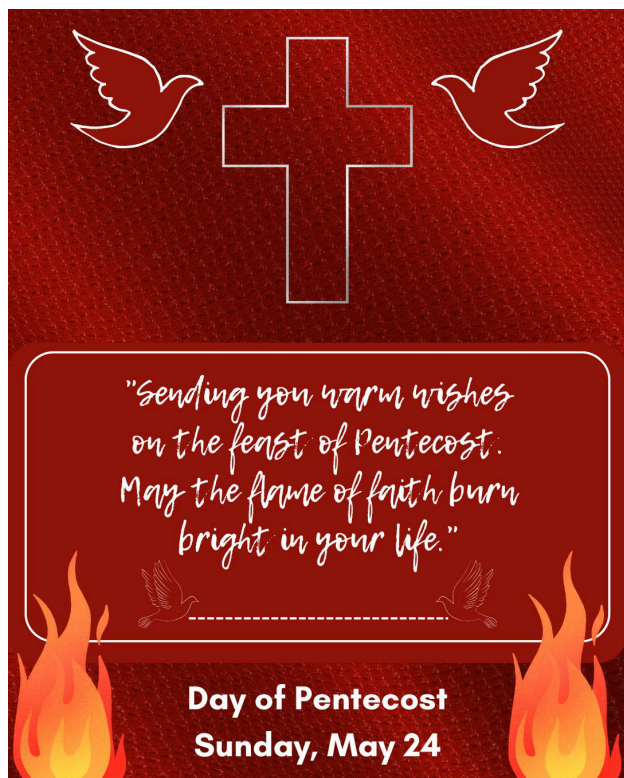
When we are loving God with our heart, soul, and mind, we are more in tune with His Spirit within us. The Holy Spirit is a helper and a guide.

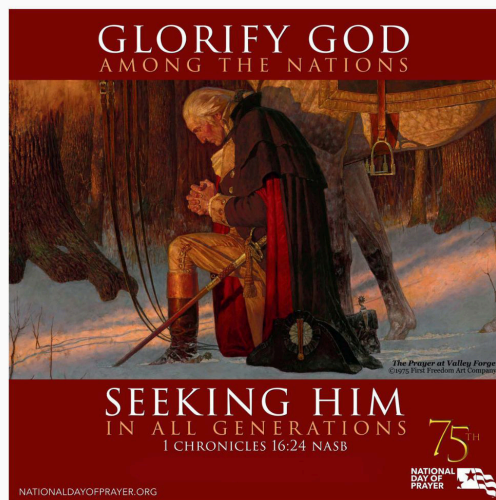

Ministry Spotlight: Education

At Bethany, our Education Ministry is all about helping people of every age grow in their faith, deepen their understanding of Scripture, and build meaningful connections with others.

Sunday School is a cornerstone of our ministry, with classes available for ages 3 and up. We offer eight adult classes that reflect a wide variety of age groups, teaching styles, and topics, making it easy for everyone to find a place where they feel comfortable and engaged.

Our **Women's Bible Studies** provide opportunities for connection and spiritual growth through three different groups that meet on various days and times. These groups primarily focus on book studies and offer a welcoming environment for fellowship and discussion.

For men, we offer **four study groups** that meet at times ranging from early morning to mid-afternoon. These groups include a mix of book studies, Bible studies, and a prayer group, allowing participants to find a rhythm and focus that fits their schedule and interests.


Bethany Now, held on Wednesday evenings from September through April, offers classes for ages 4 and up. Led by experienced teachers, these sessions cover a variety of engaging topics and provide another meaningful midweek opportunity for learning and growth.

In addition, Bethany provides access to two online streaming platforms—**Amplify Media** and **RightNow Media**—which offer a wide range of resources including Bible studies, book studies, children's programming, and more. These tools make it easy to continue growing in faith anytime, anywhere.

No matter your age or stage of life, there's a place for you in Bethany's Education Ministry. We invite you to get involved, stay curious, and continue growing in your faith journey.

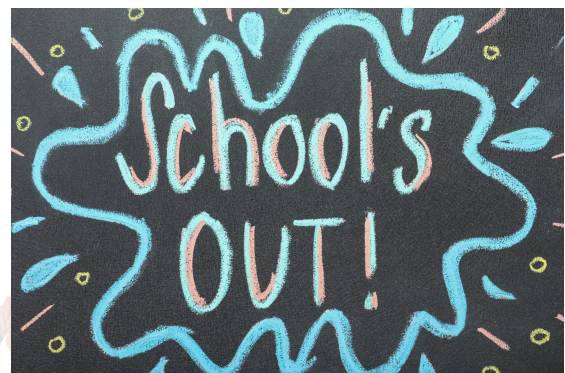






Happy Hearts Luncheon
