2.	In what ways does gathering regularly with other believers strengthen our walk with God?
3.	God used the priests' example to teach that holiness is not contagious. What does this mean for our personal spiritual life?
4.	Why can't holiness be passed on simply by being around godly people or attending church?
5.	What does the illustration of the "unclean person touching something clean" teach us about the power of sin to corrupt?
6.	How might unconfessed sin affect our service, ministry, or good works today?

7.	What does it mean when God says, "Consider your ways"? How can this phrase serve as a spiritual checkpoint for us?
8.	Why can we not expect God's blessing when we knowingly live in disobedience to Him?
9.	How does remembering our past failures help us better appreciate God's grace and faithfulness?
10.	God said, "From this day I will bless you." What does this reveal about the connection between repentance and blessing?
11.	In what ways does Christ "turn the world upside down," as seen in His teaching and example?
