1. What does it mean that Jesus is the “cornerstone,” and why is that image so important for understanding our faith?

2. Why do you think Jesus was rejected by many, even though He was “choice and precious” in God’s sight?

3. How does the illustration of something being overlooked but later found valuable help us understand how the world views Jesus?

4. What does it mean for believers to be described as “living stones” in a spiritual house?

5. In what ways should our lives be “built upon” Christ as the cornerstone in everyday decisions and relationships?

6. What does it look like practically to avoid compartmentalizing Jesus into only certain parts of your life?

7. How does understanding that we are a “holy priesthood” change the way we live and serve God?

8. Why is it significant that we now have direct access to God through Jesus as our High Priest?

9. Why does Jesus become a “stumbling block” to some people, both in Peter’s time and today?

10. How can we remain both loving and truthful when confronting sin in a culture that often rejects biblical teaching?

11. How should the reality of being brought “out of darkness into light” shape the way you live and share your faith with others?
