

Do Not Fear

Reflection

Peter commands believers not to fear or be intimidated. This is not because suffering is easy, but because God is greater than whatever we face. Peter himself knew what fear looked like. He denied Christ out of fear, yet later rejoiced when suffering for the gospel. Courage comes not from our own strength but from confidence in God.

Illustration

A child walking beside a loving parent often faces uncertain situations with confidence because they trust the one holding their hand.

Application

Identify an area where fear is affecting your faith or witness. Ask God to replace fear with confidence rooted in His presence.

Prayer

Lord, help me to trust You more than my fears. Give me courage to stand firm and remain faithful in difficult circumstances.
