

Day 2: Sent with Purpose

Scripture

Titus 1:1 (NASB 1995)

"Paul, a bond-servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ..."

Reflection

Paul knew he had been sent by God. His life was not accidental or purposeless. Every conversation, every journey, and every hardship became an opportunity to advance the gospel.

Most believers will never serve as missionaries overseas or stand behind a pulpit each week, but every Christian has been commissioned by Christ. We have been sent into neighborhoods, workplaces, classrooms, ball fields, and communities to represent Him.

Too often we divide life into sacred and secular categories. We imagine that ministry belongs to pastors while ordinary people simply go to work and pay the bills. Scripture paints a different picture. God strategically places His people where they can influence others for Christ.

Your workplace is a mission field. Your home is a mission field. Your community is a mission field. God has sent you there for a reason.

Illustration

A letter has little value if it never leaves the mailbox. It fulfills its purpose only when it is delivered to its intended destination.

Application

Ask God to show you one person in your sphere of influence who needs encouragement, prayer, or a gospel conversation. Take a practical step toward reaching out to that person today.
