

Titus 2 Discussion Questions

1. Paul begins this chapter by instructing Titus to teach sound doctrine. Why is sound doctrine essential for the health of a church, and what dangers arise when biblical truth is neglected?

2. How can older men intentionally invest in the next generation of believers through their example, encouragement, and wisdom?

3. Paul calls older women to lives marked by reverence, self-control, and godly speech. How do these qualities strengthen both the church and the home?

4. Why is it important for younger women to have mature Christian women who model faithful living? Who has served as that kind of example in your life?

5. Paul instructs young men to be sensible and to back up their words with godly actions. Why is integrity so important for a believer's witness?

6. What does it mean to have 'sound in speech' and be 'above reproach' in today's culture? How can Christians live this out practically?

7. Healthy churches depend not only on pastors and teachers but also on faithful workers serving behind the scenes. What are some unseen ministries that make a church effective?

8. In what ways can your personal example either strengthen or weaken the spiritual health of your church family?

9. Which group in Titus 2—older men, older women, younger women, younger men, or workers—do you most closely identify with? What specific challenge from this passage do you need to apply this week?
