

Titus 2:11–15 Discussion Questions

1. According to Titus 2:11–15, why is God’s grace the foundation of our salvation? Why is it important to remember that salvation cannot be earned or deserved?

2. The sermon emphasizes that God’s grace extends to all people. How does this truth shape the way we view those who seem far from God?

3. Paul teaches that grace does more than save us—it continues to teach us. In what practical ways has God’s grace changed the way you think, speak, or live since becoming a Christian?

4. Paul teaches that believers should deny ungodliness and worldly desires while living soberly, righteously, and godly. Which of these areas do you find most challenging, and how can God’s grace help you grow?

5. Titus says believers were redeemed in order to be purified as God’s own special people. What does it look like for Christians to be noticeably different from the world without withdrawing from it?

6. How does looking forward to Christ’s return motivate believers to pursue holiness and good works today?

7. The sermon explained that Christ’s love and sacrifice should increase our desire to abandon sinful habits. What sinful attitudes or behaviors most commonly compete for your devotion to Christ?

8. Paul instructs Titus to teach, encourage, and rebuke with authority. Why are all three responsibilities necessary for a healthy church?

9. How can believers lovingly encourage one another toward spiritual growth while also being willing to speak biblical truth when correction is needed?

10. What specific truth from Titus 2:11–15 challenges or encourages you the most, and what is one practical step you will take this week in response to God’s grace?
