1. Why is the word “through” important in understanding David’s description of walking through the valley?

2. What kinds of valleys do believers commonly face in life, and how can those seasons test our faith?

3. How does the shepherd’s journey through dangerous valleys help us understand our dependence upon God during difficult times?

4. What does the phrase “You are with me” teach us about God’s presence in seasons of hardship and uncertainty?

5. How can remembering that Jesus knows our needs help us respond differently to fear, grief, or discouragement?

6. In what ways does God provide rest, strength, encouragement, and guidance while we are walking through a difficult season?

7. How does the shepherd's rod illustrate the way Scripture examines and exposes hidden sin, weakness, or spiritual injury in our lives?

8. Why is it important to allow God's Word to correct and convict us rather than merely comfort us?

9. How does Scripture serve as a source of protection and help us resist temptation and avoid destructive choices?

10. Why is trust necessary if we are going to follow the guidance of the Holy Spirit?

11. What practices help us stay closely connected to the Holy Spirit throughout the day?
