1. Why is it significant that David says God prepares the table rather than David preparing it for himself?

2. How does the shepherd's preparation of grazing land help illustrate the ways God prepares ahead of us?

3. What does the progression from the valley to the table teach us about God's faithfulness through changing seasons of life?

4. How can remembering that nothing in our lives surprises God strengthen our trust in Him?

5. Why is it important that God prepares the table in the presence of David's enemies rather than first removing them?

6. What does this verse teach us about the difference between the absence of opposition and having security in the presence of opposition?

7. How can faith in God allow us to experience peace even when difficult circumstances remain unresolved?

8. What is the difference between merely being tolerated by God and being welcomed as an honored guest?

9. How does God's willingness to welcome us reflect His mercy and grace, especially when we have failed or wandered from Him?

10. Why is it significant that David's cup is overflowing even though his enemies are still present?

11. How can a believer truthfully say, "My cup runs over," during a season of grief, uncertainty, or hardship?
