1. What do the phrases “goodness” and “mercy” teach us about the character of God?

2. How do passages like Psalm 86:5, Psalm 100:5, and Lamentations 3:22–23 strengthen our confidence in God’s goodness and mercy?

3. How can the way we respond to hardship either leave behind goodness and mercy or bitterness and destruction?

4. What does the comparison between poorly shepherded sheep and well-shepherded sheep teach us about the importance of following God’s leadership?

5. What kind of “wake” do you think your attitudes, words, and actions leave behind in your relationships?

6. How can Christians intentionally leave a church, workplace, friendship, or family relationship better than they found it?

7. What does it look like for others to see the love and lifestyle of Jesus in the way we treat people?

8. How does Jesus' statement that He is "the way" shape our understanding of how a person receives eternal life?

9. What does it mean to have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ rather than simply knowing about Him?

10. How can we begin "dwelling in the house of the Lord" now by living consciously in God's presence each day?

11. What practical choices can help us live for God's glory, serve others, and lead people toward a relationship with Christ?
