

Habakkuk 2 Discussion Questions

Habakkuk 2:1-4

1. Habakkuk deliberately positioned himself to hear from God. What are some practical ways we can put ourselves in a better position to hear God's direction when we are confused or uncertain?

2. What distractions most often keep us from slowing down enough to listen for God?

3. Habakkuk expected God to answer him. What is the difference between expecting God to speak and demanding that God answer in the way or timing we want?

4. Why do you think we sometimes pray for God to move and then seem surprised when He actually does?

5. Habakkuk was willing to accept correction from God. Why is admitting that we may be wrong such an important part of spiritual maturity?

6. What are some common ways pride causes us to resist correction from God or from other people?

7. God told Habakkuk to write the vision plainly. Why is it important that our beliefs, decisions, morals, and priorities be grounded in God's Word rather than in culture, tradition, or personal preference?

8. God told Habakkuk that the vision was for an appointed time. Why is trusting God's timing often more difficult than trusting His ability?

9. What are some ways we are tempted to move ahead of God when we feel that He is taking too long?

10. How can pride damage relationships, teamwork, and ministry within a church?

11. Habakkuk 2:4 says, "the righteous will live by his faith." Based on this passage, what does it look like practically to live by faith when we do not understand what God is doing?
