SUNDAY EXPERIENCE



7 CORE

At Waterbrook we have seven core values at the center of what we believe, who we are, and what we do.

We believe these are essential for genuine, life-change. Embracing these values, we move from merely talking to engagingly walking our faith.



WORSHIP

Romans 11:33-12:2, John 4:24, Ephesians 5:18-24

Worship is actively responding to God both individually and as a church to who God is and what He has done; expressed in the things we say and the way we live.



COMMUNITY

Colossians 3:12-17, Ephesians 4:1-6, Hebrews 10:24-25

Genuine biblical community means living in caring relationships that are guided by biblical truth and grounded in spiritual accountability. We value real community, and yes, we know how messy and hard it is. But, we also know that real and lasting life-change - spiritual transformation - primarily occurs in the unity and diversity of authentic relationships.



PRAYER

Matthew 6:5-13, 1 Thessalonians 5:17, 2 Thessalonians 3:1-2, Ephesians 6:18

We are committed to under-girding every ministry with intentional and faithful prayer. Prayer is the practical demonstration that acknowledges that God is powerful and we are not. We will constantly call one another and this fellowship to prayer.



GROWTH

Ephesians 4:14-16, Philippians 1:6, Colossians 1:2-29, 2 Peter 3:18

Spiritual growth means that over time we are becoming, looking, and acting more and more like Jesus Christ. It is progressively moving toward spiritual maturity. A commitment to growth is not easy, because growth means change, and change is difficult. However, growth means we are living, really living, as the life of Christ is reproduced in our own lives.

VALUES



SERVICE

Ephesians 4:11-13, Mark 10:43-45, 1 Peter 4:10-11

Jesus demonstrated that the most influential life is a life of sacrificial service. In the words of Mark's gospel, Jesus "did not come to be served by to serve, and give His life as a ransom for many." Likewise, we believe that we will influence the world for Christ, when resting in, and motivated by His great love for us, we extend that love through our own hands and feet in acts of service to others.



GENEROSITY

John 3:16, Proverbs 11:25, 2 Corinthians 8-9

Every act of God is an act of lavish generosity. He gives freely, fully, graciously and without measure. Generosity means living life with our hearts and hands open, generously giving away the truth, time, talent, and treasure that God so graciously entrusted to us.



EVANGELISM

Mark 16:15-16, John 3:16, Colossians 4:3, Luke 10:2, Luke 19:10

We believe that we are called to intentionally build bridges to people who are without Christ. We believe that every person should be equipped to clearly and boldly explain the good news of the gospel. We believe that evangelism, like prayer, must be intrinsically woven into every ministry at Waterbrook.

DISTINCTIVES

1. We believe in the authority and relevant application of God's Word throughout each day and moment of the week.
2. We believe in Team Ministry.
3. We believe in the power and absolute priority of relationships.
4. We believe in the church's responsibility to equip the community of believers for kingdom building.

6. We believe in missions and have committed ourselves to setting aside 10% of our budget to support missionaries and short-term mission trips.
7. Waterbrook Bible Fellowship values the ministry of women.
8. Waterbrook Bible Fellowship is committed to influencing our community.
9. Waterbrook Bible Fellowship is committed to maintaining a fluid culture.

BELIEFS

THE BIBLE

(2 Timothy 3:16-17; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Hebrews 4:12)

We believe that the Scriptures in all 66 books of the Old and New Testaments are verbally inspired of God, error free in the original manuscripts, and the supreme authority of faith and practice for followers of Christ.

GOD

(Deuteronomy 6:4)

We believe there is one living and true God, who is one in essence, while eternally existing in three distinct persons; Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

MAN

(Genesis 1:26-27; Romans 1:18-32, 3:10-23)

We believe that mankind was directly created in the image of God to enjoy His fellowship and fulfill His purposes on earth. However, in Adam, all mankind fell into sin; consequently all people are spiritually dead and subject to the certainty of both physical and spiritual death apart from faith in Jesus Christ.

SALVATION

(John 1:12, 3:16, 14:6; Ephesians 2:8-9)

We believe that salvation is by grace alone, through faith alone in Jesus Christ alone. All who believe in Him are declared righteous by the Father on the grounds of Jesus Christ's life, death and resurrection, being regenerated by and baptized in the Holy Spirit.

THE CHURCH

(Acts 2:41-47; Hebrews 10:24-25; 1 Corinthians 12-14)

We believe that all who are "born again" by the Holy Spirit belong to the one true church and are instructed by the Scriptures to associate themselves in local, visible churches.

THE FUTURE

(Matthew 24-25; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18)

We believe the next great event of human history will be the personal return of Jesus Christ (Rapture). This is the blessed hope for which all those who love Christ yearn. While the exact time of Christ's return is unknown, it is imminent and certain.

LEADERSHIP

(1 Timothy 3:1-13; Titus 1:5-9; Acts 6:1-6)

We believe that Jesus Christ leads the local church through a plurality of elders who have been called, gifted, and appointed by Him. By seeking the mind of Christ, depending upon the Holy Spirit and diligently examining the Word of God, the elders provide spiritual oversight and direction for the church. The qualifications of elders are character-based as defined in 1 Timothy and Titus.

ORDINANCES

BAPTISM

(Matt. 28:18-20; Romans 6:3-7)

We believe that baptism is an essential “first step” for all who having believed in Christ for salvation, desire to walk as His disciple. Baptism is a clear injunction of the Scriptures which outwardly expresses the inward reality of new life in Christ. Our method of baptism is immersion as described in the New Testament and practiced in the early church.

COMMUNION

(1 Corinthians 11:23-29)

We believe that the Lord’s Supper is a memorial of Christ and His redemptive death. It is also an expression of our fellowship with one another. In communion we are reminded of Christ’s first coming, and encouraged to look forward to His coming again.

SALVATION

We believe that salvation is by grace alone, through faith alone in Jesus Christ alone. All who believe in Him are declared righteous by the Father on the grounds of Jesus Christ’s life, death and resurrection, being regenerated by and baptized in the Holy Spirit.

GET CONNECTED

If you are looking for what the next steps might be at Waterbrook, we'd suggest the following:

FIND YOUR PLACE LUNCH

We host quarterly lunches with the intention of giving people who are new to Waterbrook a chance to meet the staff and for the staff to meet you. If you've been here less than a year and haven't attended one of these lunches, please make plans to attend.

WATERBROOK 101

Every other month we hold a class called Waterbrook 101 where attendees get a chance to hear the history of Waterbrook, learn about theology, our leadership structure, our ministries, and ask questions.

MEMBERSHIP AT WATERBROOK

After attending Waterbrook 101 class, you can become a member of Waterbrook by submitting an application which is reviewed by the Elder council. We ask members to commit to being actively involved at the church in their worship, generosity, service, prayer, commitment to community, growth, and evangelism.

SERVE IN A MINISTRY

You don't have to be a member to serve in some ministries at Waterbrook, but we do ask for those who consider Waterbrook their church home to find a place to get plugged in and involved. This is a great way to be part of making and growing disciples!

NEXT GEN



We are committed to reaching the next generation for Christ. We believe that the best way to do that is through intentional relationships and strong Biblical teaching. From the youngest in the building to the next leaders of families, businesses, and church, investing in the next generation has a profound impact on families. To learn more about any of our groups that meet each week, visit our website. We have groups that meet every week across all ages.



KIDS CLASSES

All school age children (K-4th) meet in the Student & Discipleship 200 Building where they meet in grade-level classes for fun, games, crafts, and a Bible study lesson from the Gospel Project curriculum. Nursery through Preschool are more than just “childcare” and meet in the 100 Building. Classes are led by our screened and approved children’s teaching volunteers.

STUDENTS

Students includes grades 5-12 that breakout into smaller groups by grade level. 5th-6th graders meet at 11am in one of the breakout rooms of the student ministry area. All our Jr High and High School students meet together on Sunday mornings at the same time in the large room in the student ministry area.



YOUNG ADULTS

The Harbor is our fellowship group for young adults aged 18-30. If you need a place of rest and peace or a place of community with other young adults, we invite you to join us on Sunday nights at 6:00pm for worship and Bible study.





Waterbrook Wee School is located in the children's area on the Waterbrook campus. We have classes for your "Wee Ones" ages 18 months to 5 years old!

Wee School is open daily from 9am to 2pm Monday through Thursday with extended hours from 8:00am to 9:00am and 2:00pm to 3:00pm. Extended hours are flexible as needed by the family. You can enroll your child in Wee School from 1 day a week to 4 days a week depending on your child's and families needs. All students pay a once per year registration and supply fee depending on the number of days they will attend. Wee School families do not pay for days that our Wee School is closed due to holiday or staff development days and follow the Wylie ISD calendar.

MORE GATHERINGS

LIVING THE LIFE

For all adults, this class meets in the Youth Room at 9:30 am. Primarily focused on life discussions of personal growth, relationships, and how Scripture applies to our lives. This adult class is led by Bob Williams and Ross Perterson.

THRU THE WORD

For all adults, this class meets in the Orange Classroom at 9:30 am. Focused on a careful study through the text of Scripture. These studies are led by Jim Woolard, Brian Jeffreys, and Karl Kloppmann.

YOUNGISH

For couples or singles that have kids living at home. This is a discussions based Bible study on varying topics. This class meets at 11 am in the Orange Classroom in the 200 building.

MINISTRIES AT WATERBROOK

WOMEN'S MINISTRY

The Women's Ministry of Waterbrook seeks to connect women of different ages and life stages together in a way that fosters discipleship.

MEETINGS



SUNDAY PRE-SERVICE PRAYER

If you feel led, please join us every Sunday morning from 9:00am to 9:15am every Sunday in the Auditorium for a time of self-guided prayer. Pray by yourself or with a partner.

We are giving you a vital invitation into the highest calling of a person and a church – the call to pray and plead with God to do what we know we cannot do.

Waterbrook is God's church and Jesus is the Head. We will ask Him to guide us in transition. We will ask Him for spiritual fruit for His glory. We will ask Him for His Kingdom to come and His will to be done as He told us.

He has the power. We do not. Wage war in the heavenlies! The stakes are high! Pray with us!

A few verses behind our core value of Prayer

1 Thessalonians 5:17 (ESV)
Pray without ceasing.

2 Thessalonians 3:1-2 (ESV)

Finally, brothers, pray for us, that the word of the Lord may speed ahead and be honored, as happened among you, 2 and that we may be delivered from wicked and evil men. For not all have faith.

Ephesians 6:18 (ESV)

Praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints.



Waterbrook's mission is to *glorify God by making and growing disciples in Wylie and beyond.*

Part of accomplishing this mission is “growing disciples”. But what does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus? Our definition here at Waterbrook is: “As a believer, discipleship is growing in your knowledge and understanding of Jesus with the purpose of becoming like him and doing like he did.”

To get people to this point though, there has to be a starting point. That's why we see everything we do as a pathway to discipleship. That pathway starts with people finding connection with others at Waterbrook. That connection creates an opportunity for people to experience community. Community isn't the end goal though, we see community as a necessity to help people have the opportunity to pursue discipleship.

Connection → Community → Discipleship

Let's look at those in more detail...

Connection

Connections are bridges that lead people into community and belonging. They happen when two or more people find a shared interest, experience, stage of life, or belief. These connections give people a common ground that can lead to an opportunity for that new person to find community within Waterbrook. It has to start with connection, without it, people don't feel like they belong and instead see themselves as outsiders to the work that God is doing here.

Community

Community is when people experience God through the love of others. Community is where strangers become family, where masks come down, and where people discover they are not alone. It is where people realize that they are known, loved, and belong. Good community combats the greatest need in our culture today, loneliness. It's a grace-filled space that says, “You belong here,” while also gently challenging each person to grow. More than just a group of people, community is a spiritual home where vulnerability is safe, love is authentic, and discipleship happens naturally through genuine relationships.

Discipleship

As a believer, discipleship is growing in your knowledge and understanding of Jesus with the purpose of becoming like him and doing like he did. Simplified, discipleship is the marriage of what you know and what you do. The key to discipleship is that it cannot be done alone. While we can learn about Jesus in our personal studies, to truly live like him, we have to do it in relationship with others.

HOW DO I KNOW IF I'M GROWING AS A DISCIPLE?

Like any good workout or financial plan, it's important to know where you're going with discipleship. Here at Waterbrook, we believe that our 7 core biblical values are the picture of what the life of a disciple of Jesus looks like.

It's a person who is engaged in consistent corporate and personal worship of God, devoted to prayer and evangelism, the sharing of their faith with others. It's someone who is living in community with other believers, growing spiritually, generous with their time, talents and treasures, and actively serving both inside and outside the church.

WHAT IS MY NEXT STEP?

If your journey is just starting at Waterbrook, then we want to get connected to others. You can do that by visiting our various Community Groups, checking out an Interest Group, or joining us for an upcoming church-wide event.

If you are looking to find community, then we would encourage you to check out our various types of community groups. Give it some time too! Community doesn't happen immediately, it takes time and consistency. And don't be afraid to try different groups. Sometimes you need some time to try out a group to see if it is the right fit for you. If not, then try something else.

If you are looking to be grow as a disciple, then we want to walk with you in that journey! On our website, you'll find tools, resources, and upcoming classes to help you learn in your knowledge and understanding of God's word. Remember though that discipleship doesn't happen in isolation, you need to be in close relationship with others where you can be transparent, honest, and accountable.
