

-From the Pastor's Desk"Abigail acted quickly." - 1 Samuel 25:12

Happy Mother's Day! There are so many Godly examples of women in the Bible who rose to the occasion of need. Character in the face of crisis. Some were Esther; Deborah; Jochebed; Ruth; Mary. Lesser known Priscilla; Lydia; and always a favorite grandmother Lois. One woman in the Bible who would fall into the second category is Abigail. A competent woman of honor, married to a "Nabal" (no offense intended to anyone) who worked out of her character in a time of crisis to save her Family. It is often said that "crisis builds character", but I believe that is wrong. Crisis "reveals" character. And certainly this is true in her encounter with David.


The background can be found in 1 Samuel chapter 25 and there are (5) outstanding character traits I find in Abigail's response to impending disaster brought on by the arrogance and insolence of her husband Nabal. Briefly, David and his men had protected Nabal's many, many sheep in his flock from thieves that plagued the area they were feeding and wild animals. After months of service David sent young messengers to Nabal asking for a small gift for his protection. Nabal's shepherds attested to David's protection and generosity. Nabal however dismissed David's minimal request and dishonored him before his men (v17). Instead of trusting God to provide, David flew into a rage arming his men to come and take by force many times what Nabal could have graciously offered.

Upon hearing of her husband's response to David's request we find in her many admirable traits. First she acted decisively (v18). "Quickly" is how the Hebrew word is translated. With "haste". She knew what a generous amount was and gave orders for this "gift" to be collected and loaded. Secondly I find she acted directly (v19). Abigail did not send servants or anyone else. She went. This is in keeping with Godly character as God sent no one else. He kept Abraham from sacrificing his son but when it came to His only begotten Son He sent Him. Thirdly Abigail acted discretely (v19). She involved minimal people to save the situation. Fourthly Abigail acted **discerningly** (v23-24, 36). Last I find she acted determinedly (v37-38). She did not rest until the full story had been told. So it is with God! He decisively acted in the Garden when Adam sinned. God acted directly when He made the first and final sacrifices for our sin. God has acted discretely in not adding to man's shame of sin but rather atoned for it on the cross. God acted discerningly when He made the open offer of salvation to all men laying at our feet the ultimate responsibility of eternity. Finally, I believe God acted determinedly in not resting until the full Gospel story be told. Thank You to the amazing women of Scripture and who helped shape our - Pastor Ted lives.
