## **Music Ministry**

How does a twelve-day European choir tour become a reality? The planning process started about eighteen months before take-off, with selecting the destination countries. By August 2024, fifty-five people had committed to this trip, including choir singers, brass players, and their families and friends. Participants ranged in age from 8 to 80, and it was a special gift getting to share this part of the year with music students from West Chester University.



We performed at three wonderful churches, each providing a completely different experience. The Church of St. James in Ljubljana was built in 1613 in the Baroque style. It had excellent acoustics, which was a huge help for both the rehearsal and the concert. The Church of Saint Blaise in Zagreb was built in 1915 and featured a beautiful interior but somewhat challenging acoustics. We will remember that church as the hottest performance venue due to the lack of air conditioning and the 95-degree weather.

## **Music Ministry**

The Church of St. John Paul II in Trogir was proof of how modern architecture can be stunning, practical, and yet have great acoustics. This was the only concert venue with air conditioning, but unfortunately, the whole town lost power about 1.5 hours before our concert, so the building was not as cool as expected. We were in the middle of eating dinner at a local restaurant when the power outage happened, and had to leave Pastor Andrew behind, who would take care of the check when the power came back (fortunately he made it back in time for the concert!). The church and the parish center were consecrated in 2021 and were situated right next to a bay. Seeing the crystal-clear blue sea after leaving the church will remain in our memories and in many photographs for years to come.



The trip was not only a reminder of the extraordinary beauty of God's creation, but a chance for our church members and friends to connect with one another in a way that only the shared experiences and rigors of travel can provide.

We marveled at the extraordinary beauty of crystal-clear Alpine lakes, shared meals of fresh seafood and homemade strudel, climbed a truly unholy number of steps, and supported each other through hikes that the guidebooks assured us were "easy" but were in reality anything but. Sandor put together a program that mixed pieces familiar to us with those commonly sung in our host countries, which increased our appreciation for one another's culture and history. We found the spirit of hospitality and commitment to mutual care we found in Slovenia, Croatia and Montenegro to be inspiring and something to bring home with us. It was an unforgettable trip, and we thank our parish associates for their help and the congregation for allowing our worship leaders to accompany our choir on this adventure.

This fall we look forward to welcoming back our choir into worship as they enjoyed a much needed break over the summer. Music is one of the hearts of First Pres as we seek to worship God together through sound and words. Our Contemporary Worship Band will continue this fall with incredible worship music at our 10:45AM service. Look out for information about the Fall Worship Night. We again look forward to special music from our Chancel Choir and our beloved Christmas Concert, Our Children's Choir will be back in full swing, and we look forward to being led in worship by our young musicians.

The new Sunday School year begins on September  $7^{\rm th}$  – we can't wait to welcome back your kids!


- Who: 4-year-old Preschool kids 5th graders (divided among 3 classes by age)

This October, First Pres is offering a fun program to encourage people of all ages to read their Bibles! Modeled after the BOOK IT! program that Pizza Hut has sponsored for decades to encourage elementary school children to read, our Bible Book-It program will ask participants to set weekly Bible reading goals, get a small prize for meeting their goals at a weekly check-in and conclude with a celebratory party!

## **Midweek Journeys**

For many years, First Pres held programs for all ages on Wednesday nights, which collectively was referred to as "Bridge." This fall, we're re-naming the Wednesday night adult study group, which will now be called Midweek Journeys. Studies will change every 4-8 weeks, and people are welcome to attend every week or come and go based on the study. This fall all are invited to join a new Midweek Journeys study titled "The Bible With and Without Jesus: How Jews and Christians Read the Same Stories Differently." Bible scholars and teachers Amy-Jill Levine and Marc Z. Brettler will lead us on a tour of the most popular Hebrew Bible passages quoted in the New Testament to show what the texts meant in their original contexts and then how Jews and Christians, over time, understood those same texts. This study and its discussions will be led by Sara Pantazes and Pastor Andrew.

This study will be offered in a hybrid format, meaning participants can attend in person or via Zoom, on Wednesdays from 6:30 – 8 PM beginning October 8 and concluding on November 12. More information and study books will be available in coming weeks.










## Mission

During the season of Lent, First Pres members raised \$50,550 to support urgent needs in our community. Since then, your gifts have made a profound difference in the lives of our neighbors:

- A domestic violence survivor needed rental assistance after missing work to care for a critically ill sibling.
- We were able to provide brief respite hotel stays for people who are homeless and working night shifts; shelters are not staffed for daytime sleeping or showers. We also provided emergency hotel stays for disabled veterans waiting for federal housing assistance.
- A phone and short-term data plan were obtained for an unhoused man looking for work; he is now employed full time.

Each day the church receives calls for assistance from neighbors like these and many others. Despite the generosity of our church members and the relatively small amounts we contribute to each household (on average \$342) the funds we allocate for each month are gone within the first few days.

## **Mission**

We make difficult decisions about who receives help, prioritizing those who owe relatively small amounts and folks who can contribute some money toward the total cost of their bills. We also know that even when we can't help financially, we can offer a listening ear, an invitation to Wednesday Lunch, or (thanks to the women of PW) items from the children's clothing closet. This ministry is hard work – it takes the time, resources, and emotional energy of our congregation. And it's good work, because it puts our eyes and our treasure right where Jesus says to place them. On behalf of the hundreds of people who have felt God's grace through your gifts so far this year, the Missions Committee thanks you.

## **Wednesday Lunch Needs**

Our Wednesday Lunch program continues to thrive, providing hot, nourishing meals each week at 11:30am. The main course is prepared by our friends downstairs at Mistral French & Fast; volunteers bring sides and desserts to share, and then we all eat together.
