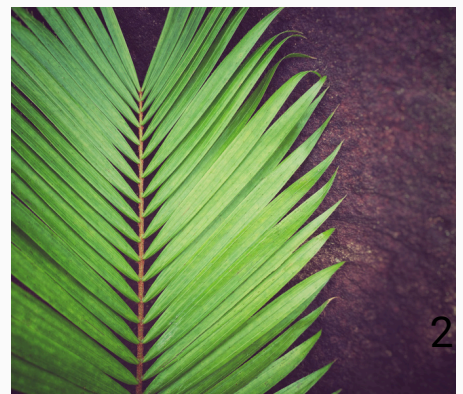

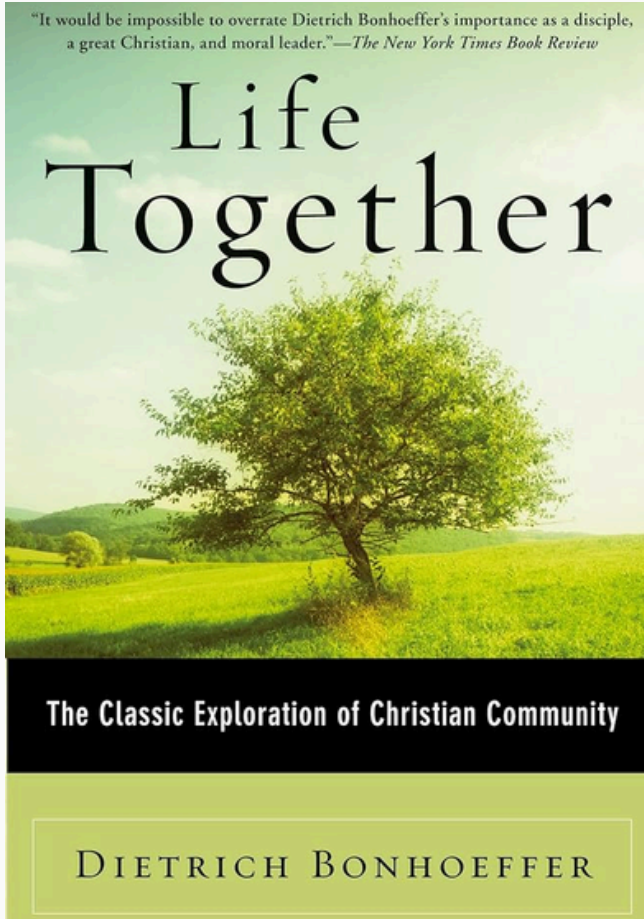

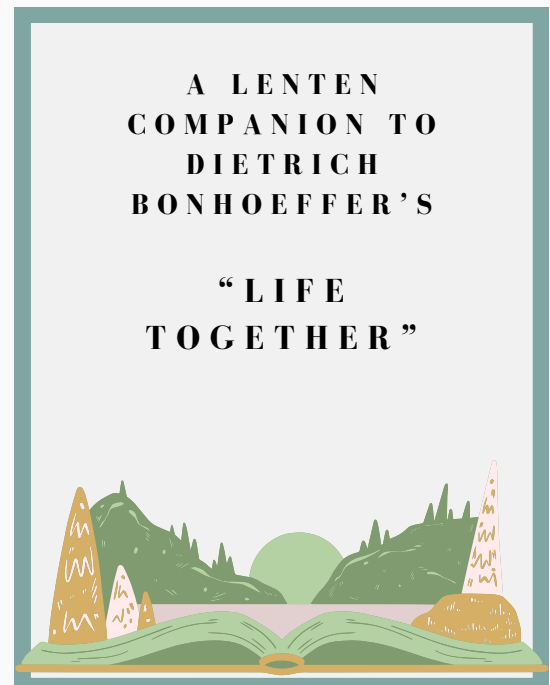

During the season of Lent, as a church we are going to be reading Dietrich Bonhoeffer's highly regarded, *Life Together*. This might seem like an interesting book for the season of Lent, but in Lent we are called out of our comfort zones, we are reminded of our insufficiencies, and our utter reliance upon God. In *Life Together* Bonhoeffer calls us to action, to discipleship, and to communal living. In our fast-paced overly busy world, the call to communal life together is indeed a call out of our comfort zones, out of the busyness, the stress, and the deadlines we've become so accustomed to. So, together we are going to embrace the call for life, *Life Together*.

To help individuals, small groups, and bible studies, we have compiled a weekly companion to Bonhoeffer's *Life Together*.

This companion follows the chapters of the book and provides a description of the main ideas in each chapter, along with discussion questions to be used either in a group setting or for individual reflection. We hope this companion will bring about meaningful discussion and spiritual growth as we journey through Lent together.

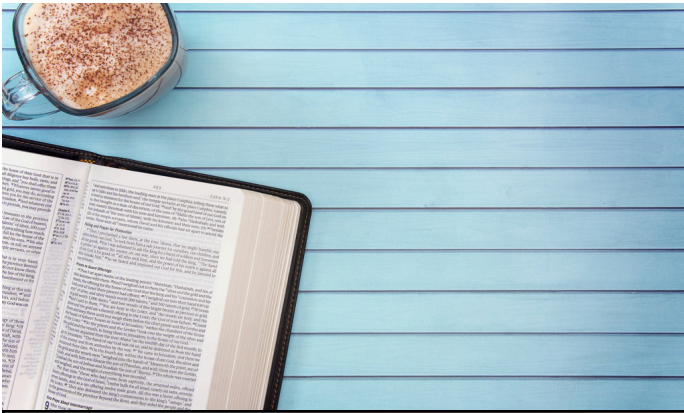

Family Lent Activity Calendar

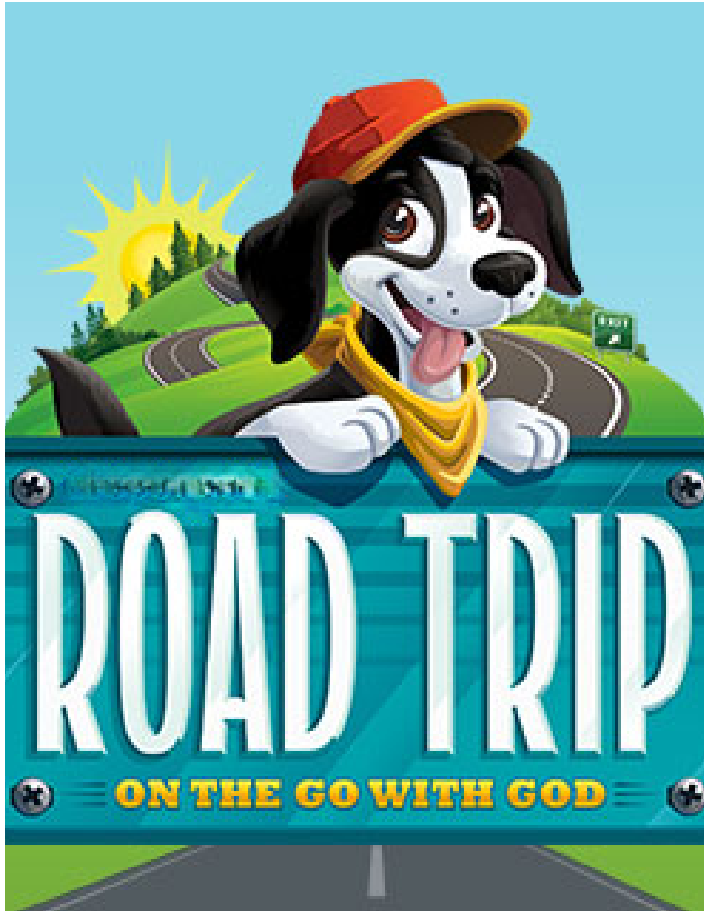

Matthew 25 Lent Campaign

Nearly every day of the year First Pres receives a call or visit from a neighbor in need. Many of these folks are working, some at multiple jobs, but still can't make ends meet given the high rents in our area. Some people call because they can't afford critical car repairs, or need help accessing a resource. Others are fleeing domestic violence or just need someone caring to speak with. When times are tough, our community knows that they can trust our church to live out Jesus' message of compassion and care.

Each year during Lent, First Pres members join together to serve the most vulnerable people in our community by raising \$25,000 or more to fund emergency housing, utility, and transportation needs that can't be met by an existing community program or agency. Despite the fact that we live in the wealthiest county in the state and there are robust non-profit programs designed to help, there are still many people who fall through the cracks and whose urgent need can't be met through existing programs.

Thanks to your generosity, in 2024 First Pres helped 197 people with over \$30,000 in emergency assistance. Those who received help included:

- A military couple experiencing homelessness who needed a brief hotel stay before their VA-supported apartment was available.
- A domestic violence survivor who was finally able to move into her own place thanks to a security deposit provided by First Pres.
- Grandparents raising young children who fell behind on rent or utilities.

We know that in 2025 the need for assistance will continue to grow as rents and inflation climb. And we are confident that there is no challenge too great for Christ: the one who calls us to worship him by serving the vulnerable will equip us for the work ahead.

This Lent, we ask that you consider giving toward our \$25,000 goal. Whether your budget allows for \$20, \$200, or \$2,000, the funds you give will make a profound difference in the life of one of our neighbors.
