

PASTOR'S NOTE

A New Year Challenge

It's a new year. A blank page. A clean start. How will this year be different than the year before? Honestly, that depends on God, but it also depends a lot on you. What would you attempt to do for God's glory this year that you've never attempted before if you knew that you couldn't fail? That's a scary question isn't it. But since we are being honest and transparent here, that is exactly what Jesus promised his wide-eyed disciples right before he went to the cross. You don't believe me? Perhaps, you will believe Him. Or maybe you won't. That doesn't depend on me as much as it does you. So, here it is in black and white.

"I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. 13 And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father. 14 You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it." John 14: 12-13 (NIV)

Have you ever noticed how we love to water down this verse (as well as many others)? Why? Because we don't live up to it. Listen to some of the reasons we try to rationalize our lack of faith: Jesus means that we will do the kinds of works He does, compassionate good deeds, but with no miracles; or He means that the church as a whole will accomplish even more of His work throughout history. But none of these things is really what He said.

Jesus, our Risen Lord and King, implies that when He goes to the Father and sends His Spirit, our potential will be no more limited than that of His own. In other words, the sky's the limit. Or to quote Andrew Murry, "Your Christian life is to be continuous proof that God works in impossibilities.

The truth of the matter is that every aspect of Jesus' relationship with the Father is now made available to us through the Spirit. In the Gospels, God gives us a picture of what he can do when he clothes himself in human flesh, and that picture is Jesus. The thing that both scares and amazes us is that Jesus said that can also be a picture of us.

Here is your challenge and mine as we go into 2026. Do not be satisfied with a feckless, powerless faith that bears no resemblance to Jesus. It is not consistent with the teachings of Jesus or the New Testament as a whole. Ask Jesus to show you what this verse means, not by informing you but by demonstrating it in you.

Stretch your faith by making whatever adjustments you must make for this promise to be realized in your life. The work of God is not limited by our concept of weak, human flesh. The potential is amazing. Ask God to let you see it become a reality in your life and the lives of those around you.



MISSIONS MINISTRIES

When is it okay to ask for help?

Why is it so difficult to ask for help? For many, the thought of needing assistance feels like a sign of weakness. We worry about being a burden, or that our request will be seen as an admission of failure. In a world that often celebrates independence and self being sufficient, turning to others can feel like a last resort.

But the Bible tells us a different story. In Acts 20:35, we read that Jesus himself said, “It is more blessed to give than to receive.” While this is often interpreted as a call to generosity, it also highlights the profound blessing that comes with helping others. When we allow someone to help us, we are offering them a sacred opportunity to live out their faith. We are giving them the chance to be a blessing, to put love into action, and to experience the joy of giving.

Just as there is a blessing in giving, there is a profound blessing in receiving. When we humbly accept help, we are not only acknowledging our own need but also affirming the goodness and generosity of others. We are creating a space for community, for shared burdens, and for Christ’s love to flow between us.

It’s a beautiful cycle: we give and are blessed, and we receive and, in doing so, we bless others.



So, how do we navigate this journey of giving and receiving?

- Turn to the Holy Spirit: When you are faced with a burden that feels too heavy to carry alone, or when you are in a position to help someone, seek guidance from the Holy Spirit. Pray for wisdom, and for the courage to either extend a hand or humbly accept one.
- Embrace Humility: Recognize that every one of us has a time when the load becomes too heavy. There is no shame in admitting you need help, and no pride in believing you can do it all alone.
- See It as a Shared Blessing: Remember that giving and receiving are two sides of the same coin. When we allow others to help us, we are giving them a gift—the gift of being able to live out their faith and experience the true joy of giving.

Let us be a community that not only gives generously but also receives graciously, always turning to Jesus Christ as our guide. If you need help with household projects that seem too difficult, please contact the church office for GraceWorks assistance.

GriefShare Grief Support Group

Grief is a painful and confusing process, no matter the circumstances. GriefShare is a safe, welcoming place where people who have experienced loss can find understanding, encouragement, and support. This 13-week program helps participants learn what is normal in grief, what to expect in the days ahead, and healthy ways to cope with grief's many emotions and challenges.

Each weekly meeting includes a video featuring experienced counselors, pastors, and healthcare professionals, along with real-life stories from people who have walked through grief. Following the video, participants gather in small groups for discussion, support, and personal application. Each attendee will also receive a workbook filled with helpful exercises to use at home.

Topics include managing emotions such as loneliness, anxiety, sadness, anger, and regret; navigating changes in life and relationships; and finding hope when grief feels overwhelming. Many participants share that GriefShare provides comfort and relief by offering guidance in a space where others truly understand.

Whether your loss is recent or happened some time ago, you are welcome. If you have experienced the death of a family member or friend, we invite you to attend.

The next 13-week session begins January 29, meeting Thursdays from 10:30 AM-12:30 PM in Room 219 of the Family Life Center.

What?

2 options: General or Restricted

Tithe or offering is typically considered unrestricted, meaning that the church uses it as needed within the bounds of the budget. Giving an unrestricted gift is the best way to support the church as a whole without singling out a specific ministry.

Sometimes, we feel called to give above-and-beyond our regular offering in order to support a specific ministry. To do so, leave a memo on your gift with the title of the ministry you'd like to support. This "restricts" those funds to be used specifically in that ministry. Certain ministry leaders, pastors, or committees handle funds for each restricted account. For example, Pastor Andrew decides how to use funds in the youth fund.

A HOUSE OF PRAYER

A HOUSE OF PRAYER: His house, My house, Your house.

“My house shall be called a house of prayer ...” Matthew 21:13

As we reflect on the amazing year and a half that we have just been through and are preparing to enter into the New Year, I will be the first to tell you that God has been good to us and deserves all the praise and glory due Him. Everything we have seen God do at McConnell over the past year has not been the result of our clever imaginations or great leadership but is a direct response from our Heavenly Father to the prayers of McConnell’s people.

When we seek God’s face, his will, and his priorities for his church, God listens, responds, and sometimes does more than we could have ever hoped for or imagined. And yet, we have wondered what might have happened if we had made prayer a higher priority, not just at church but also at home? Would we have seen even greater things happening in our families, our church, our county, our nation, and our world? Would His kingdom have advanced in even greater power ways than we have seen? We believe the answer is yes, we would’ve. While we do not claim to know all that God has in store for us in 2026, we are sure of one thing. God wants prayer to be one of our highest priorities at McConnell. Nothing of eternal significance is going to happen apart from prayer other than lost not knowing Jesus as their savior and missing heaven.

Think about this with us for a minute. When Jesus said, “My house will be called a house of prayer...”, he wasn’t just speaking of the Temple at Jerusalem. He was standing in it. The Temple was his house, a house of prayer and worship for the nations, and not just his people. It’s clear that God wants not only the church to be a house of prayer but his people to be a people of prayer as well.
