Hope this Newsletter finds all well with you and yours. The work is of God and according to His purpose. First, I would like to send out our "thank yous" to all of who have prayed, given, and sacrificed to help get the Gospel out to Sub-Sahara Africa. Thank you for your partnership.

This month we are highlighting one of our men who is doing a fabulous work in Malawi with the deaf. Paul Muyanda is a graduate of our Bible Institute at Kafulafuta and has been serving the Lord since he got saved. He is currently serving in Malawi, reaching the hearing impaired (deaf), with the Word of God. Please take time to read his powerful testimony. Please pray and lift him up before the Lord. He is most worthy of your prayers and financial support. He is a servant of the Lord who walks in faith, to please God in all areas.

Many years ago a woman by the name of Gomeju, came from Ethiopia to work with us and the deaf. She taught my girls sign language, and my second born daughter, Krissy was my interpreter. The first time she interpreted for me, 17 deaf men came forward to be saved. Krissy, 14 at the time, looked at me and asked, 'Dad what do I do?' I said, lead them to Jesus. She said, but I can't tell them to bow their heads and close their eyes! I said you're right, it is okay to pray with the eyes open. That is how the deaf hear. The first man she led to the Lord was Samson Daka, who I had the honor of training in ministry. He is still pastoring the very first deaf church in Zambia, First Bible Baptist Deaf Church of Ndola.

One time, many years ago, one of the deaf said to me, Ba Bonner, I cannot hear you, but when God speaks to me, I have to put my fingers in my ears, cause the Spirit is so loud to my soul!!! Yes, the deaf need to be reached with the Gospel. It has been such a blessing to see hundreds of deaf come to Jesus, and see them tell others of the saving grace of Jesus Christ.

Once again, thank you for all you have done and will do, for His glory always. In Jesus name.
