A comparison of Elijah and John the Baptist...

The OT prophets foretold of a prophet that would precede the Messiah, preparing the way for Him (Mal 3:1; Is 40:3) and identified this forerunner as Elijah (Mal 4:5-6). Gabriel announcing John the Baptist's conception and John's father referred to those prophecies (Luke 1:17, 76). The gospel writers and John the Baptist, himself, align those OT prophecies with John the Baptist (Mr 1:2-4, Jo 1:23). Jesus says that John would have been Elijah if the people would have received it (Mt 11:13-14; 17:10-13). Consider the following parallels between Elijah & John the Baptist:

The account of King Herod & Herodias persecuting John the Baptist mirrors the account of King Ahab & Jezebel persecuting Elijah (1 Kings 18-21).
