The Jews understood portions of Scripture but didn't discern 2 comings of the Messiah – the first as the suffering servant, the second as the conquering king. The pattern of Moses pictured this. The first time Moses presents himself to the Jews, they reject him – *Who made thee a prince and a judge over us?* (Ex 2:14); he goes away, receives a Gentile bride, and returns to deliver His people.

Prophetically, the second coming is likened to the days of the Exodus (Hos 2:14-18). In the Tribulation, Satan's persecution will again drive Israel into the wilderness (Rev 12:6, 14; Cf. Mt 24:15-16) for 3½ years. During that time, God will miraculously feed Israel with Satan's broken heads (Ps 74:12-15).

*Luke 9:11; (Cf. Lu 17:21; Jo 18:36)*

#### ***The comparison of Moses and Jesus...***

Deuteronomy 18:18 prophesies that the Messiah will be like unto Moses. Jesus made direct comparisons in John 1:17; 3:14-16; 6:32. Peter and especially Stephen revealed that Jesus was the fulfillment of this prophecy (Acts 3:22; 7:20-39). Below are some ways that Moses foreshadows Christ:

1. 4 books about his life (Ex, Lev, Num, Deut; Mt, Mr, Lu, Jo)
2. Hidden by family from an evil king during a baby genocide, preserved in Egypt, and called out of Egypt (Ex 1:22-2:4; 4:22-23; Mt 2:13-16)
3. Loved and cared for by Miriam (i.e. Mary)
4. Adopted (Ex 2:10; Mt 1:25)
5. Long period of silence from childhood to adulthood
6. Sent by God (Ac 7:34; Lu 10:15; John 3:17; 6:29; 17:3)
7. Called God's chosen (Ps 106:23; Lu 23:35)
8. A prophet (Deu 34:10; John 6:14)
9. A priest (Ex 24:4-7; Ps 99:6; Heb 4:14)
10. A king (Deu 33:5; Jn 18:33-37)
11. A shepherd (Ex 3:1; John 10:11)
12. Exhibited leadership of meekness (Num 12:3; Mt 11:29)
13. Gave bread from heaven (Ex 16:35; Deut 8:3; Jn 6:30-35)
14. Tried to save his Hebrew kinsmen (Ex 2:11-12; Mr 7:26-27)
15. Showed compassion to a Gentile woman at a well (Ex 2:15-19; John 4:7-26)
16. Abdicated the palace to deliver God's people from slavery (Ex 2; Heb 11:24-26; Php 2:5-11)
17. Identified with his people (Heb 11:25; 2:10-11)
18. Rejected from ruling by his own (Ex 2:14; John 1:11; 19:15)
19. Almost stoned by those he tried to save (Ex 17:4; Jn 8:59; 10:31)
20. Went to Gentiles and married a Gentile bride (Ex 2:15-21; Num 12:1; Ro 11:25; Eph 5:25-32)
21. Usurped by their siblings (Num 12:1; Jn 7:3-5)
22. Spent 40 days fasting in the desert (Ex 24:18; 24:28; Mt 4:2)
23. Began his ministry in the wilderness (Ex 3:1-9; Mt 4:1-11)
24. Experienced God's glory on a mountain (Ex 34:29, 35; Mt 17:2)
25. Gave God's dispensational covenant on a mountain (Ex 20:1-31:18; 34:1-35; Mt 5-7)
26. Performed signs and miracles over nature (Ex 7:20-21; 14:21; Mt 8:23-27) and feeding multitudes in the wilderness (Ex 16:8, 31; Mr 6:35; 8:4)
27. Offered his life for the forgiveness of others (Ex 32:32-33; 1Pe 2:23-24)
28. Sent out 12 men (Num 13:1-18; Lu 9:1-2) and empowered 70 more (Num 11:24-25; Lu 10:1-19)
29. His burial and missing body generated disputes (Deu 34:5-6; Jude 9; Mt 28:11-15)
30. Has a second coming after his death (Mt 17:3; Heb 9:27-28; Ac 1:3)
