Dear Pastor and friends,

The Lord showed up in a big way at the Immigration checkpoint when we were crossing the Belize/Guatemala border to get our pastors from Guatemala to our school. Our truck was loaded with pastors front and back. The Immigration officer never got out of his chair to inspect passports and check names, he just moved his finger for me to cross and that has never happened before. Somebody was praying and we praise God for answered prayer.

The Lord showed up again in the Pastors School. We had 42 pastors in school and 33 Sunday School teachers to be trained for VBS. The heat and humidity was hard to endure. The cooks were constantly bringing 5 gallon buckets of ice water to the school to keep everyone hydrated. There was no complaining and the students were locked in on the word of God. There have been 25 people who have accepted Jesus Christ as their Savior since we were there in March. Praise the Lord for these salvations.

The Sunday School is spreading in Guatemala. Three Sunday School teachers crossed the Belize/Guatemala border in the "bush" to avoid the immigration checkpoint. They not only wanted to learn how VBS was done, but wanted to show their appreciation for the SS being started in Guatemala. They did not know what a Sunday School was before Sarita Ishim and her parents (Bro. Juan Ishim and Juanita) went to Guatemala to show them how to start it. They also came to support the inauguration and celebration of the Glynda Anderson Christian Academy in the village of Santa Theresa. Maya Missions had nothing to do with planning the SS celebration or the naming of the building. The people were so happy to get the gospel that they wanted to honor Glynda, since she started the Sunday School. It was a great day. They wanted her to dress like the other Kekchi women, so they gave her a traditional Kekchi skirt and top that had 8 yards of material in it.

As some of you know, Bro. Marcos Makin has stage 4 cancer all over his body and was sent home to die. Please add his name to your prayer lists.
