

## Statement of Faith

Scripture – The Bible is the inspired and infallible Word of God. (2 Tim. 3:16; 1 Peter 1:21).

The Godhead – There is a tri-unity of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (Mark 12:29; 2 Cor. 13:14; Heb. 1:1-3.)

Angels, Fallen and Unfallen – There are heavenly forces working in the world today both helping and hindering man. Satan is the originator of sin and uses his forces to battle against believers. (Gen. 3:1-19; Isa. 14:12-17; 2 Peter 2:4; Eph. 6:10-12.)

Creation and Fall – Man was created in the image of God during the literal seven day Creation. Satan tempted man into disobeying God and man fell to this temptation, creating sin. This sin caused separation from God. (Gen. 1:26; 2:17; 6:5; Rom. 3:10-19; Eph. 2:1-3.)

Jesus – Jesus is the Savior Messiah as prophesied in Scripture. He is the Son, God in flesh, born of a virgin. Jesus died on the cross for the sin of ALL mankind, past, present and future, was buried and rose again from the dead conquering sin and death. He brings eternal life and forgiveness from sin to all that believe in Him. (John 1:1, 2, 14, 18; 3:16; Phil. 2:5-8; Heb. 4:15.)

Salvation – No one can get to heaven on one's merit. Salvation comes from Jesus alone. Once a person places one's trust in Jesus for salvation, that person is immediately saved for eternity and can never lose this salvation. Once saved always saved. (Lev. 17:11; Matt. 26:28; John 3:7-18; Eph. 2:8-10; Gal. 3:22; 1 Peter 1:18-19, 23.)

Assurance – Once a person has placed his trust in the completed work of Christ he receives the free gift of eternal life, and it is always his as a promise, even if he falls, backslides or walks from the faith. (Luke 10:20; 22:32; John 5:24; Rom. 8:29; 1 John 5:13, Jude 24.)

Atonement – Jesus' death, burial and resurrection cover all sin and all peoples, those that believe and those that do not. His sacrifice was for the entire world and no one is excluded from His redemptive plan. (John 1:29; Rom. 3:25-26; 1 Peter 3:18.)

Holy Spirit – The Holy Spirit is the third person in the Godhead trinity. He gifts believers for the work of ministry and the building up of His church. He is the seal of God on every believer's life and dwells in every believer upon salvation. We believe that some gifts of the Holy Spirit such as speaking in tongues and miraculous healings were temporary and are no longer used by the Spirit. (John 14:16-17; 16:7-15; 1 Cor. 6:19; 1 Cor. 12:13; 1 Cor. 13:8; Heb. 2:3,4.)

The Tribulation – The translation of God's church will be followed by the fulfillment of Israel's 70<sup>th</sup> week. (Pre-Tribulation Rapture). (Dan. 9:27; Rev. 6:1-19:21)

The Eternal State – Once a believer dies his or her soul immediately is in the presence of the Savior. The believer's body remains until the Rapture of God's church. (John 14:1-3; 1 Cor. 15:51-52; 1 Thess. 4:13-18.)

Family – The family is God's example of love and unity between Him and His church. Marriage, defined as the union of one natural-born man to one natural-born woman, is not to be taken lightly and is to be worked at to build a strong united relationship. Children are a blessing from the Lord. Life starts at conception and, therefore, we support a right to life. Those blessed with children have the duty, as stewards over the life of those children, to strive to build them up in the healthiest physical and spiritual environment possible. (Gen. 2:24-25; Psalm 139:13; Matt. 19:4-6; Heb. 13:4).

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## ***Objectives***

- To lead students to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ (Jn. 1:12, 3:16-18).
- To lead students into an understanding of the eternal security inherent in their salvation (Jn. 10:28; I Jn. 5:13).
- To teach the Bible as God's inspired Word and to develop attitudes of love and respect toward it (Dt. 4:16, 6:6).
- To develop a desire to know and obey the will of God (Mt. 26:39).
- To encourage the students' love for Christ (Eph. 3:19).
- To train students to stand for biblical convictions (Ps. 119:46; Pr. 1:10).
- To teach students the importance of examining everything in the light of God's Word (I Cor. 2:15).
- To train leaders who will be faithful servants of God (I Cor. 3:2).
- To develop a sense of responsibility in placing God first in one's life (Mt. 6:22; Pr. 9:9,10).
- To encourage the student to recognize the importance that a Bible-believing local church plays in the life of the family (Heb. 10:25; Ps. 122:1).
- To help students see, in light of Scripture, their responsibility to tell others about the Lord (Mt. 28:18-20).
- To help students develop a good interpersonal relationship with others (Ro. 12:18).
- To encourage students to establish a daily routine of personal devotions and prayer (Jas. 5:16b; II Ti. 2:15).
- To give students a solid academic foundation in the fundamentals of learning, along with Christian training taught from a biblical point of view (Col. 3:16, 17).
- To help students develop a positive attitude toward learning (Pr. 1:5-7).
- To assist students in developing skills of reasoning (Ps. 1:2).
- To assist students in developing communication skills (Col. 4:6).
- To stimulate aesthetic values (Ex. 28:2, 3; Ps. 19:1, 2).
- To promote proper physical and social development (Lk. 2:52).
- To teach students love of country and scriptural principles of authority (Ro. 13:1, 2).

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# Tuition and Fees 2020-21

## FEES

A registration fee (K2-K4 \$250; K5-8th \$350) per student is due with the registration form. This fee includes the cost of enrollment processing, insurance, and administrative expenses.

The placement fee covers textbook rental, workbooks, supplies, activities, and parties and reserves a place for your child until the first tuition payment is made. The improvement fee is for special projects beyond the scope of our regular school budget. Placement, graduation, and improvement fees are due June 1<sup>st</sup>. Sports fees, which are billed per sport, are due at the beginning of the season for the current sport. Middle school elective fees are due at the time electives are chosen. ALL FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.

## MULTIPLE CHILD DISCOUNT

Tuition is assessed at full rate for the oldest child attending KCS. A 10% discount is provided for the next oldest child from the same family. A 20% discount is provided for the third child, a 30% for the fourth child, and so on.

A 5% discount is given if the full year's tuition is paid by August 1<sup>st</sup>. A 4% discount is given if two semi-annual tuition payments are made by August 1<sup>st</sup> and January 1<sup>st</sup>. All payments must be received by the due dates in order to qualify for the discounts.

## FINANCIAL POLICIES

A statement of your account will be mailed to your billing address by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month. (Please contact the finance office if you have not received your statement by the 15<sup>th</sup>.) Monthly payments are due on the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month. If payment is received after the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month, a \$30 late fee will be applied to your account. Special billing arrangements (such as split bills, etc.) will incur a \$15 monthly charge per account. A \$25 charge is assessed for all checks returned by the bank to be re-deposited. A \$35 charge is assessed for each check returned the second time; payment by cash or cashier's check will be required thereafter. The school reserves the right to assess a fee of 3% of the dollar amount of a returned check. Visa, Master Card, and American Express credit cards are accepted and may be debited on an automatic basis if desired.

## PAST-DUE ACCOUNTS

If your account becomes 30 days past due, your child will be suspended from class until the account is brought current. All delinquent accounts must be paid in full with cash, credit card, or cashier's check before report cards and transcripts are issued.

## VOLUNTARY WITHDRAWALS

If a student is withdrawn from school, there is no refund of tuition for the remainder of the month in which the student is withdrawn. A minimum of 10 days is needed to forward necessary records. Any financial/billing changes must be completed in writing prior to the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month.
