Salvations + Baptisms

In 2022 we recorded 1,147 people make a decision to follow Jesus and we witnessed 272 people take the plunge and get water baptised - what a significant milestone!

Melbourne Property Development

2022 was a huge year for LIFE Melbourne as we received a truly miraculous response to Expansion.

The building project for LIFE Melbourne overcame some major hurdles, but has now secured approval to become land serving God's Kingdom. It is a miracle in motion and we cannot wait to impact Melbourne with the reality of Jesus.



LIFE Homes Purchase

LIFE Homes also celebrated three decades of providing lasting home environments for people with disabilities. We purchased two new properties in Warkworth and Whangarei, the first we've been able to

purchase and own outright. It's literally a life-changer!

Healthy Lunches

LIFE Community's incredible year continues with Healthy Lunches being established in 3 low-decile schools. Across the year we served over 340,000 meals to students. We know that these lunches make a huge difference to every young person.



Community Kitchens Expansion

In 2022 we opened three brand-new Community Kitchen locations. Adelaide opened its second kitchen, Melbourne opened up a 2nd location, and Auckland opened it's eighth location. Together, we served over 86,000 meals. Each of these kitchens is a practical answer to real need, and a special place of connection, joy and hope.





In 2022 we had our first in-person Sistas Conference in 3 years, with 1,864 delegates in attending. What a privilege it is to be able to host women from all over our country and provide an opportunity for them to encounter God afresh.



Christmas Spectacular

Our Christmas Spectacular shows were the cherry on top of a fantastic year with over 9,000 people attending packed performances in Melbourne, Adelaide, and Auckland. Hundreds of volunteers poured so much of their time into creating memorable moments that brought the Christmas story to life.

Overseas Special Offering

Through the generosity of our church, we were able to raise over \$250,000 to fund two Eastern European churches who are actively involved in assisting with various local humanitarian needs.





Christmas Box

In 2022, across cities and international borders, we were able to pack and deliver 40,000 Christmas Boxes to people in need and also reached another milestone: over 1 million people impacted by Christmas Box since we started in 2001. So good!





2022 has been yet another incredible year at LIFE despite the various challenges of Covid and the economy. We have so many things to be thankful for as we reflect on God's goodness in another year and in seeing the amazing impact and change in so many people's lives through the work of each of our four focuses as we have outlined in this year's annual report. Some of the key financial highlights of 2022 have been:

Giving - We have continued to see people's faithfulness and generosity in giving with over \$23m given through tithes and Expansion offerings across LIFF.

Expansion - Through Expansion offerings (total received for 2022 \$3.4m) we were able to contribute \$1.8m into funding the growth of our own Community initiatives impacting thousands of people including: Christmas Box, LIFE Community Kitchens and The Giving Store. Also \$400k to Kingdom, \$400k to funding the set up and operation of two new campuses in West Auckland and Tauranga, and \$2.2m to the initial phases of construction of our new Melbourne campus.

Community - Our impact through LIFE Community continued to grow rapidly to the value of \$24.8m for 2022 including the value of volunteer time and sponsored and donated goods. A significant portion of this impact is through Skills Update, QES, LIFE Homes and Healthy Lunches where external funding (largely Government) not only funded the services we were able to provide to assist many people, but generated a surplus of \$1.2m enabling us to repay debt from the acquisition of Skills Update in 2021 setting a path for ongoing growth in the future.

Melbourne Campus - Considerable obstacles around planning consents were overcome and construction commenced late in 2022 on a brand new campus for Melbourne including a 600 seat auditorium, kids facilities, foyer and kitchen. Funding lines are in place with CCFS Bank to settle the purchase of Sims Street in April 2023 for a total of \$20.6m. Construction of the new campus is estimated at \$9m and is targeted to be complete by October 2023 and is being funded through the incredible lean in and generosity of people giving to Expansion and support from NZ.

Total Income and expenses – Our total income was \$47.9m with total expenses of \$42.4m. Our net surplus after funding and depreciation costs across the whole of LIFE for 2022 was \$5.5m with a \$3.9m net surplus in Church, \$0.1m in Business and \$1.5m in Community. These surpluses were largely used to fund the development of the new Melbourne campus and repay debt from the acquisition of Skills Update within LIFE Community.

Balance Sheet - We are incredibly blessed to be in a very strong financial position at the end of 2022. Through the consistent generosity of so many people across LIFE and the growth in value of our property - our total assets were valued at \$181.5m and liabilities at just \$29.3m giving us net equity of \$152.2m at 31 December 2022.

Bank Loans – Of our total liabilities \$21.0m was in bank loans. From a church perspective we became debt free on all our Auckland campus properties through Legacy at the end of 2020. Our borrowings as of December 2022 are specifically for Community (\$8.3m) with the acquisition of Skills Update in 2021 and for Business (\$10.4m) with the investment in a West Auckland fully tenanted property and the deposit on our Melbourne property (\$2.3m).

We continue to be very grateful and humbled by the faithfulness and generosity of so many people right across LIFE in their giving of time, energy, and resource to serve others through each of LIFE's Four Focuses. We look forward with expectation and excitement to the year ahead!



LIFE Adelaide celebrated its first full year as part of the LIFE family in 2022 after transitioning from Victory Church in May 2021. We have enjoyed being part of the larger LIFE family and it was great to see people fully engaging with the word during our live link sermons from New Zealand. Our 10am service attendance has steadily increased and our 5PM service has created a great family atmosphere. A particular highlight was our Christmas production, where the overwhelming feedback was on the professionalism of the production and the clear gospel message.

We are grateful for those who have joined us in 2022 and the way they embraced our discipleship pathway. We noticed new people attending Starting Point sooner than previous years and that there were a number of people who were saved, baptised, attended Alpha, and connected. 


